

The AARP Bylaws prohibit the CEO from serving on a Committee unless the charter of such committee allows the CEO to be a member. This policy confirms the need to maintain current committee charter language for those committees that must be limited to independent directors, the Compensation and Audit and Finance Committees. And finally, the policy addresses other areas concerning the CEO's service on the Board.

The current AARP CEO was elected to serve on the Board.

Other governance changes included:

The Board travel and expense policy was updated and streamlined. The policy is subject to Board approval and the procedures for expense reconciliation are delegated to the Office of the Corporate Secretary.

The National Volunteer President position was eliminated as of June 2020.

The Ethics & Compliance Office monitors compliance (with the assistance of the Corporate Secretary's Office for board members) with these requirements and ensures proper follow-up as needed.
