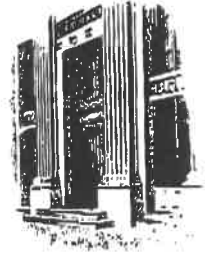

The City of Quincy is excited about the opportunity to join the AARP/World Health Organization's Age Friendly Cities Network. This initiative focuses on many of the areas the city has been working on such as housing, community engagement, transportation, outdoor spaces and social inclusion. The City of Quincy is committed to ensuring that its older residents have the services and support they need to remain in the community.

The City of Quincy is a culturally diverse community and has one of the highest population of older adults in the state. Approximately Twenty percent (20,000) of our population is age 60 and over, of which approximately eight percent are minorities.

For many years, the City has supported elders directly through the services provided by our Council on Aging. The city supports several nutrition congregate meal sites, have approved the use of CDBG funds for an elder benefit specialist and has one of the largest supportive housing programs.



Our recent development of walking and bicycles paths, expansion of our Farmer's Markets and improvement in "green space" within the city are just a few examples. - Convene an Advisory Council representing Quincy residents age 50 and older, academic partners, community organizations, and city departments
