

# **Creating an Age-Friendly City: The 2014 Neighborhood Survey of AARP Hispanic Members Age 50-plus in Denver, Colorado**

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# Key Findings

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***AARP Hispanic members in Denver say neighborhood features that improve volunteer opportunities, availability of neighborhood information, local government services, housing, and health and wellness are needed to make Denver a place where people can successfully age.***

A livable community provides resources that allow residents to age in place, and fosters residents' engagement in their community's civic, economic, and social life. The World Health Organization (WHO) has developed eight domains that help influence the health and quality of life of older adults: housing, outdoor spaces and buildings, transportation, community support and health services, social participation, respect and social inclusion, civic participation and employment, and communication and information. The AARP Colorado State Office commissioned this neighborhood survey of AARP Hispanic members age 50 and older in Denver, Colorado to better understand the needs of older adults with regards to being able to age in place, and to conduct a neighborhood needs gap analysis to identify and prioritize areas of focus. This report is based on those members who report that they are Hispanic. This survey finds that:

- ❖ **AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver have lived in Denver and their neighborhood for a long time and are likely to remain there as they get older.**
  - ✓ 71% have lived in Denver for at least 35 years and 69% have lived in their current neighborhood for at least 15 years.
  - ✓ 44% say it is extremely or very important to stay in their neighborhood, and 86% say it is extremely or very important for them to stay in their home as they age.
  - ✓ 66% say they are not very or not at all likely to move outside of Denver when they retire and stop working completely.
- ❖ **AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver own their homes and say having well-maintained homes and properties is the most important housing feature in their neighborhood.**
  - ✓ 79% own their home and 81% live in a single family home.
  - ✓ Given that most AARP members in Denver are homeowners and want to age in place, the most important housing issues to them are having well-maintained homes and properties (85%), well-maintained and safe low-income housing (69%), homes that are equipped with things like a no step entrance, wide doorways and first floor bathrooms and bedrooms (64%), and affordable housing options for all residents (64%).
- ❖ **AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver say it is important to have outdoor spaces and buildings in their neighborhood that allow access for people of different physical abilities.**
  - ✓ 83% say it is important to have sidewalks that are in good condition and accessible for assistive mobility devices, and 82% say having well-maintained public buildings and facilities that are accessible to everyone is important.
- ❖ **AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver mostly drive themselves to get around their neighborhood, and many believe it is important to have well-designed, safe streets that support all users.**
  - ✓ 89% drive, 35% walk, 20% ride with others, and 13% ride a bike to get around their community.
  - ✓ Most believe that it is extremely or very important to have well-lit and safe streets for all users (92%), well-maintained streets (90%), and easy to read traffic signs (88%).
- ❖ **AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver would be more likely to use public transportation if it were more affordable and accessible in their neighborhood.**
  - ✓ 14% use public transportation and not surprisingly, 98% of these respondents would be at least somewhat likely to use this transportation mode if it were more affordable and accessible in their neighborhood.
  - ✓ 68% do not use public transportation; however, 49% of these respondents say they would be at least somewhat likely to use it if it were more affordable and accessible in their neighborhood.

- ❖ **AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver want to stay healthy and therefore believe having good neighborhood health care facilities, services, and providers is important.**
  - ✓ Most say it is extremely or very important to have well-maintained hospitals and health care facilities (91%), nursing homes (90%), and a variety of health care professionals (87%) in their neighborhood.
  
- ❖ **AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver want to have affordable social activities in their neighborhood that appeal to diverse audiences.**
  - ✓ 71% say they interact with friends and neighbors in their community several times a week or more.
  - ✓ 82% say it is extremely or very important to have activities that are affordable to all residents, and 79% say having activities that offer senior discounts is important.
  - ✓ 68% say it is extremely or very important to have activities that involve both younger and older residents, while 67% say it is important that activities are widely publicized.
  
- ❖ **AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver want to have opportunities to volunteer in their neighborhood.**
  - ✓ 73% say it is extremely or very important to have transportation to and from volunteer activities for those residents who need it.
  - ✓ 60% say it is important to have opportunities for older adults to be community decision makers, and 60% also say having easy to find information on available volunteer opportunities is important.
  
- ❖ **AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver place high value on having local government services that will help them age in their neighborhood.**
  - ✓ 93% say that having conveniently located fire houses in their neighborhood is extremely or very important.
  - ✓ 88% say it is important to have conveniently located police stations, and 84% say having older adult protective services in their neighborhood is important.
  
- ❖ **AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver would turn to family, friends, neighbors, or their doctor or other health care professional for information on older adult services.**
  - ✓ 86% say they would turn to family, friends, or neighbors, while 79% would contact their doctor or other health care professional.
  - ✓ 77% believe it is extremely or very important to have community information that is delivered to residents who may not be able to leave their home.
  - ✓ 71% say having free access to computers and the Internet and an automated easy to understand information source (71%) is important.
  
- ❖ **AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver report a lack of neighborhood features, that is the gap between what is important and what is present in five key areas: volunteer opportunities, neighborhood information, local government services, housing, and health and wellness.**
  - ✓ Overall across these five areas, the top gaps identified in volunteer opportunities are transportation to and from activities, easy to find information on volunteering, and volunteer training.
  - ✓ The top gaps in neighborhood information are an automated easy to understand information source, clearly displayed printed information, community information that is delivered in-person, and access to information in one central source.
  - ✓ The top gap in local government services is older protective adult services.
  - ✓ The top gaps in housing are a home repair service for low-income and older adults and homes that are equipped with things like a no-step entrance, wide doorways, grab bars in bathrooms, and first floor bedrooms and bathrooms.
  - ✓ The top gap in health and wellness is affordable home health care providers.

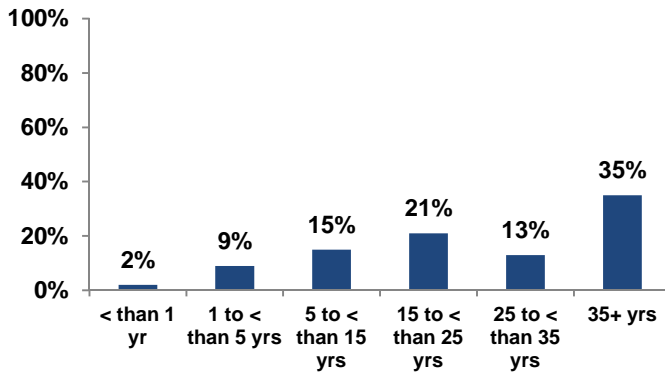
# Detailed Findings

## Neighborhood

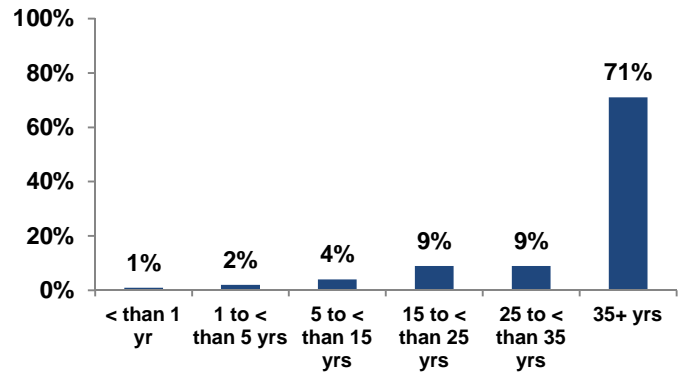
**AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver are long-time residents of their neighborhood and are unlikely to move into a different home within their neighborhood or leave their Denver neighborhood altogether.**

AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver have deep roots in their neighborhood. About seven in ten (69%) have lived in their neighborhood at least 15 years. Over a third has lived in their neighborhood for 35 years or more and over seven in ten have lived in Denver for 35 years or more.

**Length of Time AARP Hispanic Members in Denver Have Lived in Their Neighborhood (n=277)**

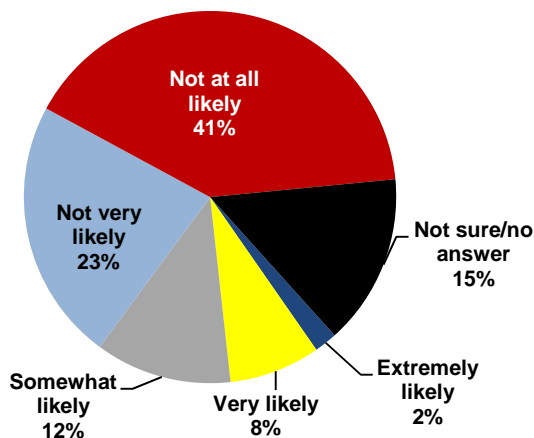


**Length of Time AARP Hispanic Members in Denver Have Lived in the City of Denver (n=277)**

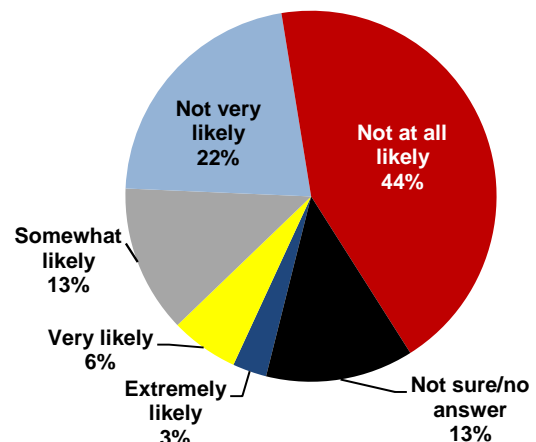


Most 50-plus AARP Hispanic members in Denver are unlikely to move into a different home *within* their neighborhood or move *outside* of Denver when they retire completely. Nearly two-thirds (64%) say they are not very or not at all likely to move to a different home *within* their neighborhood, and about another one in eight (12%) says they are only somewhat likely to do this. Two-thirds (66%) say they are not very or not at all likely to move *outside* of Denver, and another one in eight (13%) says they are only somewhat likely to do so.

**Likelihood of Moving to a Different Home outside of Denver in Retirement Years\* (n=277)**



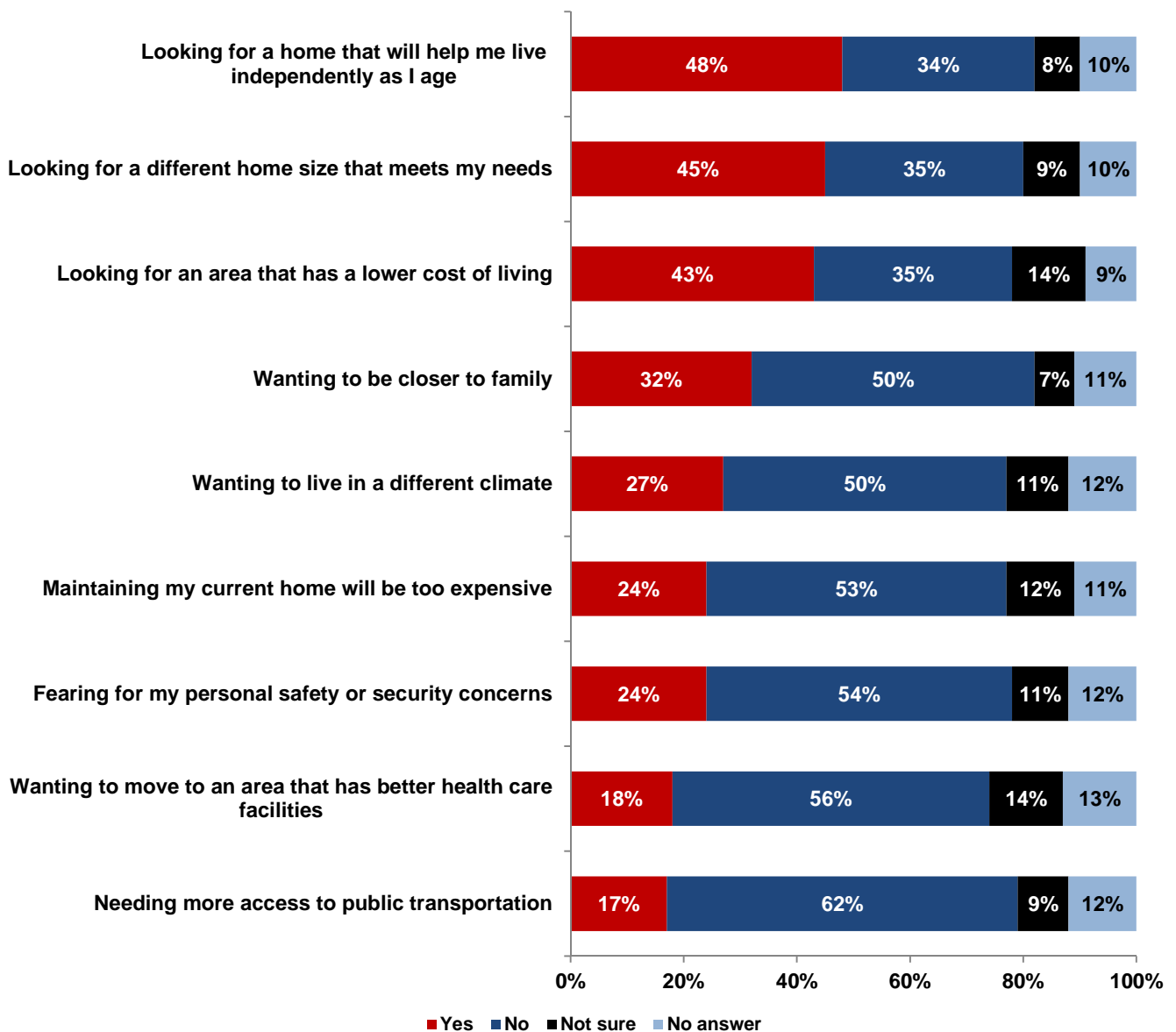

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**AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver say the top factors that would impact their decision to move out of the area when they retire completely are to find a home that will help them live independently as they age and a home that better meets their space needs.**

A second tier of factors that would impact Hispanic members' decision to move out of the Denver area after retirement are to find an area with a lower cost of living, to be closer to other family members, live in a different climate, because their Denver home is too expensive to maintain, or they fear for their personal safety. Factors that have somewhat less of an influence on members' decision to leave Denver are the desire to move to an area that has better health care facilities and public transportation.

(n=277)**

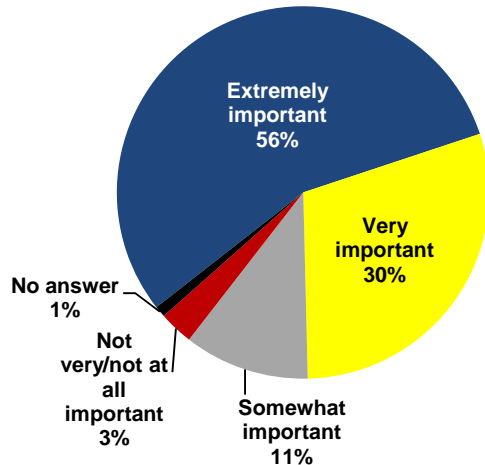

**AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver say it is important for them to remain in their home and neighborhood, and they believe their neighborhood is a good place for older people to live.**

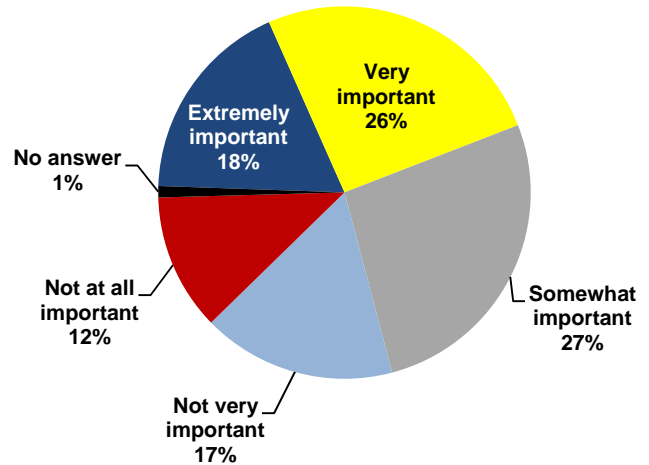
Most (86%) AARP Hispanic members in Denver say it is extremely or very important to live independently in their own home as they age. While over two in five (44%) say it is extremely or very important to stay in their neighborhood as they age.

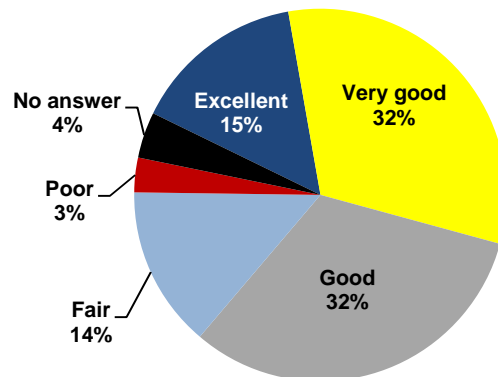
**Importance of Staying in Your Own Neighborhood\***

About eight in ten (79%) say their neighborhood is an excellent, very good, or good place for older people to live. This high rating of their community is likely influenced by the fact that many have lived there for at least 15 years and desire to remain there as they get older.

(n=277)

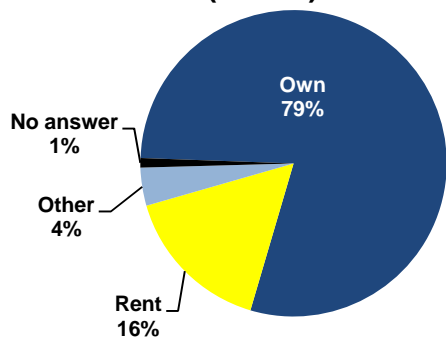


## Housing

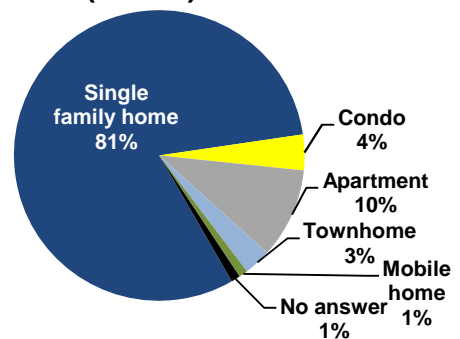
### Most 50-plus AARP Hispanic members in Denver own their own homes and live in single family homes.

The majority of AARP Hispanic members in Denver lives in a single family home while fewer live in an apartment, condominium, townhome or mobile home.

(n=277)



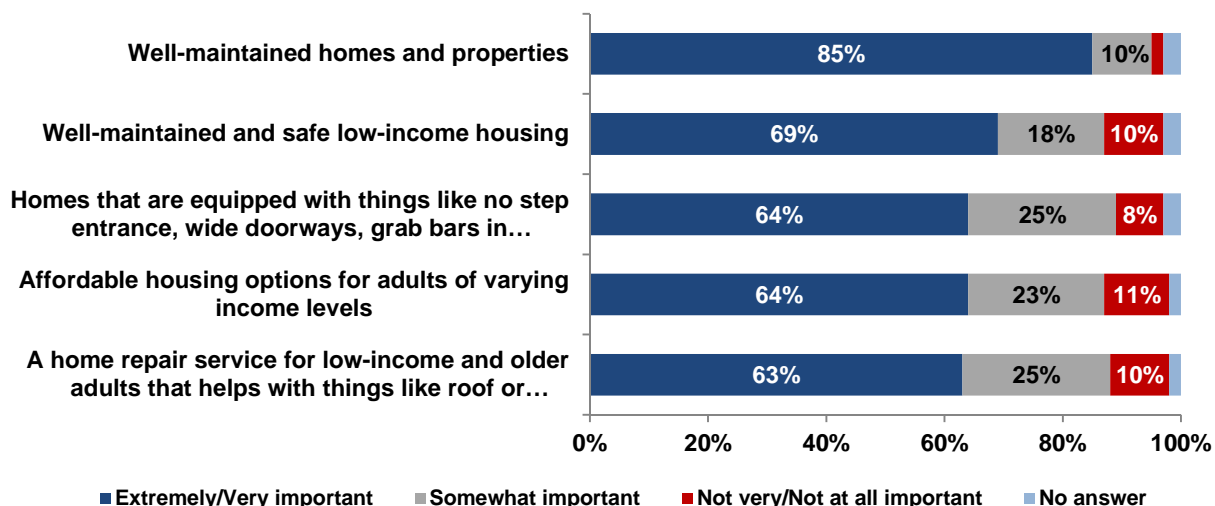
**Type of Home is Primary Residence**

### Well-maintained homes and properties is by far the most important housing feature to 50-plus AARP Hispanic members in Denver compared to any other housing feature asked about in the survey.

Most 50-plus AARP Hispanic members in Denver are home owners and say they want to live in their home and neighborhood for as long as possible, so it is not surprising that the majority place importance on home maintenance and modifications as well as affordable housing that could promote being able to stay in their home and neighborhood. Nearly seven in ten say well-maintained and safe low-income housing is important to have in their neighborhood. About two in three say homes that are equipped with things like a no step entrance, wider doorways, grab bars and first floor bedrooms and bathrooms, affordable housing options, and a repair service for low-income and older adults are extremely or very important to have in their neighborhood.

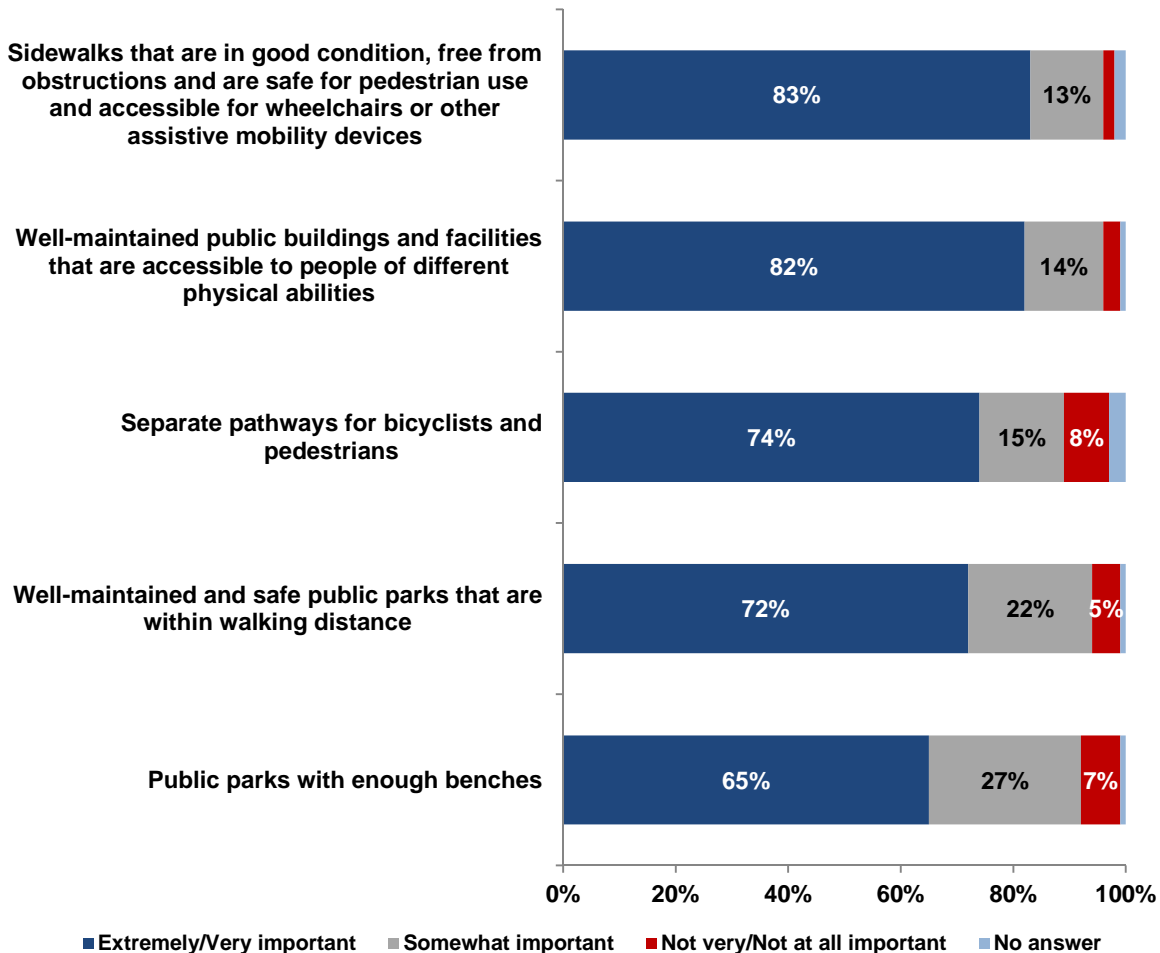


## Outdoor Spaces and Buildings

**AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver say outdoor spaces and building features that promote neighborhood mobility and ensure accessibility for people of different physical abilities are of high importance.**

When thinking about outdoor spaces and public buildings within their community, four in five or more AARP Hispanic members in Denver believe it is extremely or very important to have sidewalks that are in good condition and well-maintained public buildings and facilities that are accessible to people of different physical abilities. About three-quarters say it is important to have dedicated pathways for bicyclists and pedestrians and well-maintained and safe public parks within walking distance. Two-thirds say having parks with enough benches is an important neighborhood feature.

(n=277)



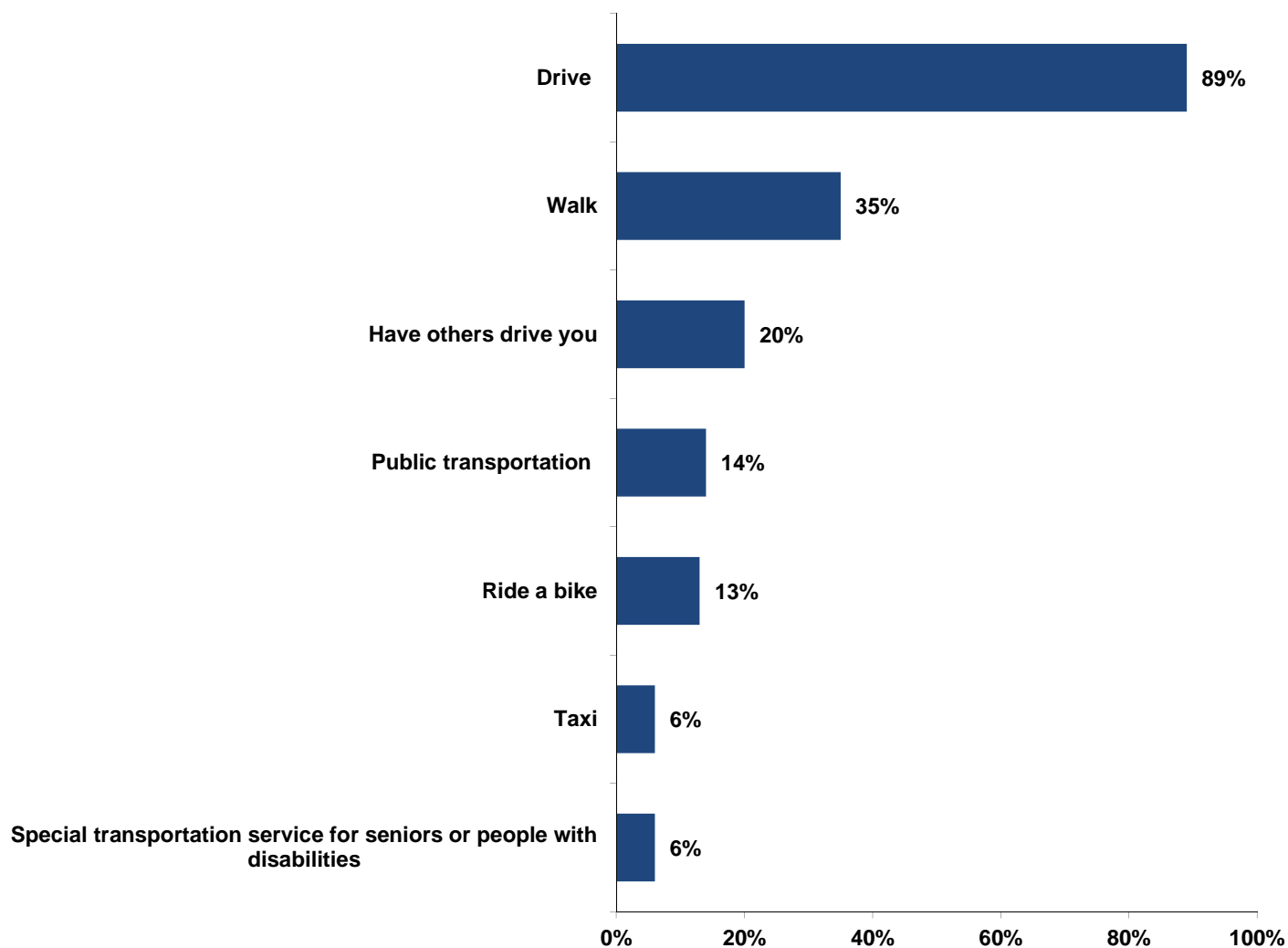

## Transportation and Streets

**Most AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver drive themselves to get to where they want to go.**

Over a third of AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver says they walk to get around their neighborhood, and another one in five gets a ride from others. One in seven uses public transportation or rides a bike. Fewer take a taxi or use a special transportation service for seniors or people with disabilities.

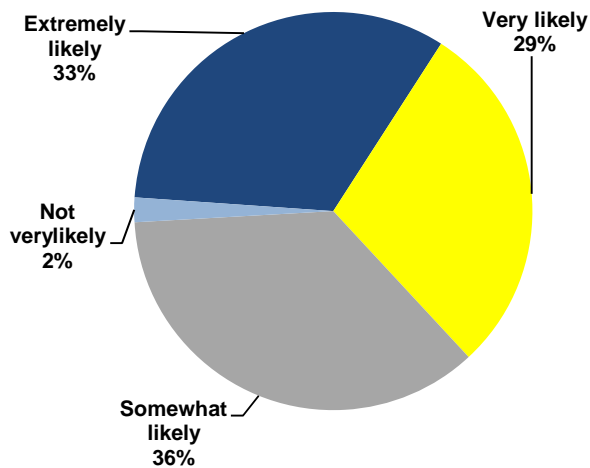
**AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver would consider using public transportation if it were more affordable and easily accessible in their neighborhood.**

One in seven (14%) AARP 50-plus Hispanic members in Denver says they use public transportation to get around while almost seven in ten (68%) say they do not use it. About three in ten (29%) current users say they have used public transportation at least once a week and another quarter (26%) has used it a couple of times a month in the last six months.

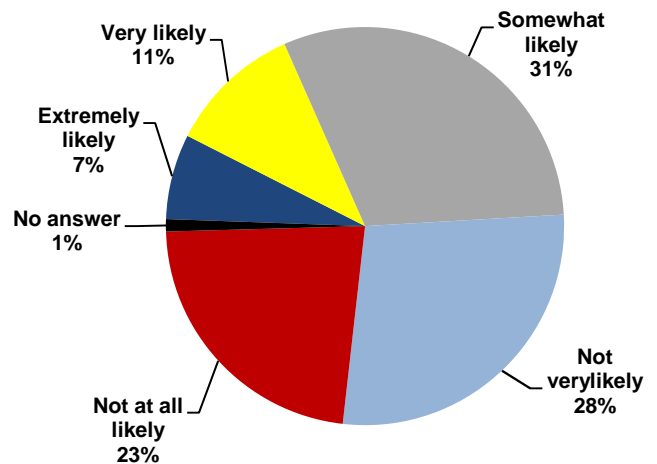
When asked how likely they would be to use public transportation if it were more affordable and easily accessible in their neighborhood, it is not surprising that over three in five of current users say they would be extremely or very likely to use it; and over another third would be at least somewhat likely to use it.

It is surprising and noteworthy that among those who do not use public transportation, over one in six says they would be extremely or very likely to use it if it were more affordable and easily accessible to them; and almost another third says they would be somewhat likely to use this method of getting around.

**Likelihood of Using Public Transportation Among Current Non-Users\* (n=190)**

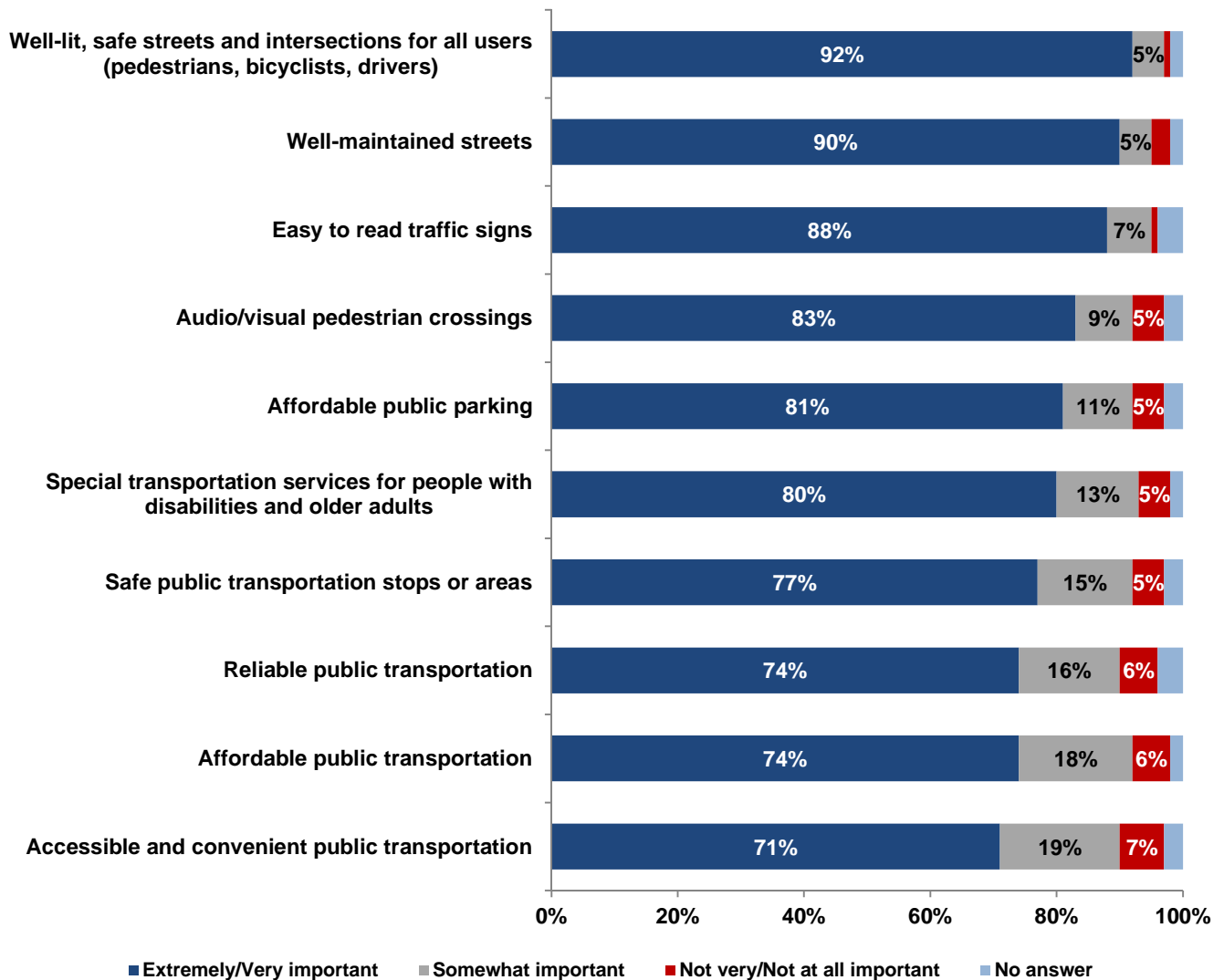

**Having streets and intersections that are safe, well-lit and maintained with easy to read traffic signs top the list for the most important neighborhood transportation features for AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver.**

Hispanic Denver members place high importance on transportation features for older adults and residents with disabilities as about four in five say having audio/visual pedestrian crossings and special transportation services are extremely or very important. Public parking is often limited in large metro areas so it not surprising that just over four in five place high importance on having affordable public parking. AARP 50-plus Hispanic members in Denver also place high importance on features that relate to public transportation. Seven in ten or more say it is important that their neighborhood have public transportation that is safe, reliable, affordable, accessible, and convenient.

**Transportation and Street Features of Importance to AARP Hispanic Members in Denver\* (n=277)**



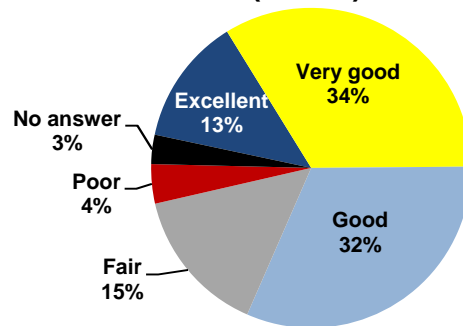

## Health and Wellness

**AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver believe they are in excellent, very good, or good health, and they exercise at least once a week.**

Nearly eight in ten (79%) say they are in excellent, very good, or good health, while 15 percent say their health is fair.

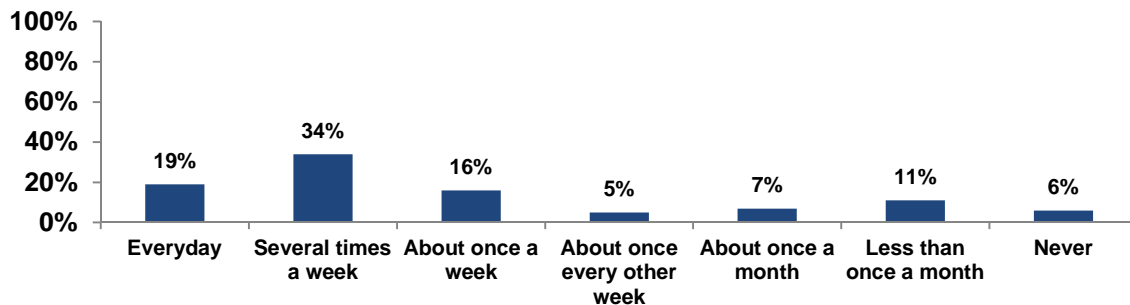
**AARP Hispanic Members in Denver Rating of Their Health\***

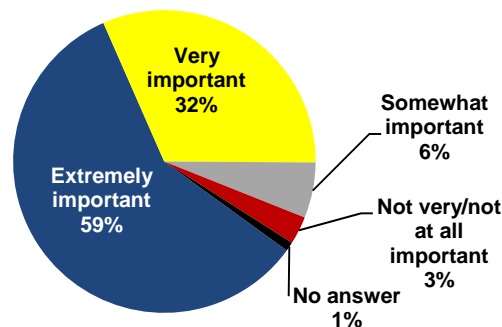
The fact that most 50-plus AARP Hispanic members in Denver perceive themselves as being healthy also is reflective of their exercise habits. Over half (53%) say they exercise every day or several times a week, and one in six (16%) says they exercise about once a week.

Given the frequency of exercising it is not surprising that nearly all (97%) 50-plus AARP Hispanic members in Denver say it is important to them to remain physically active for as long as possible.

(n=277)

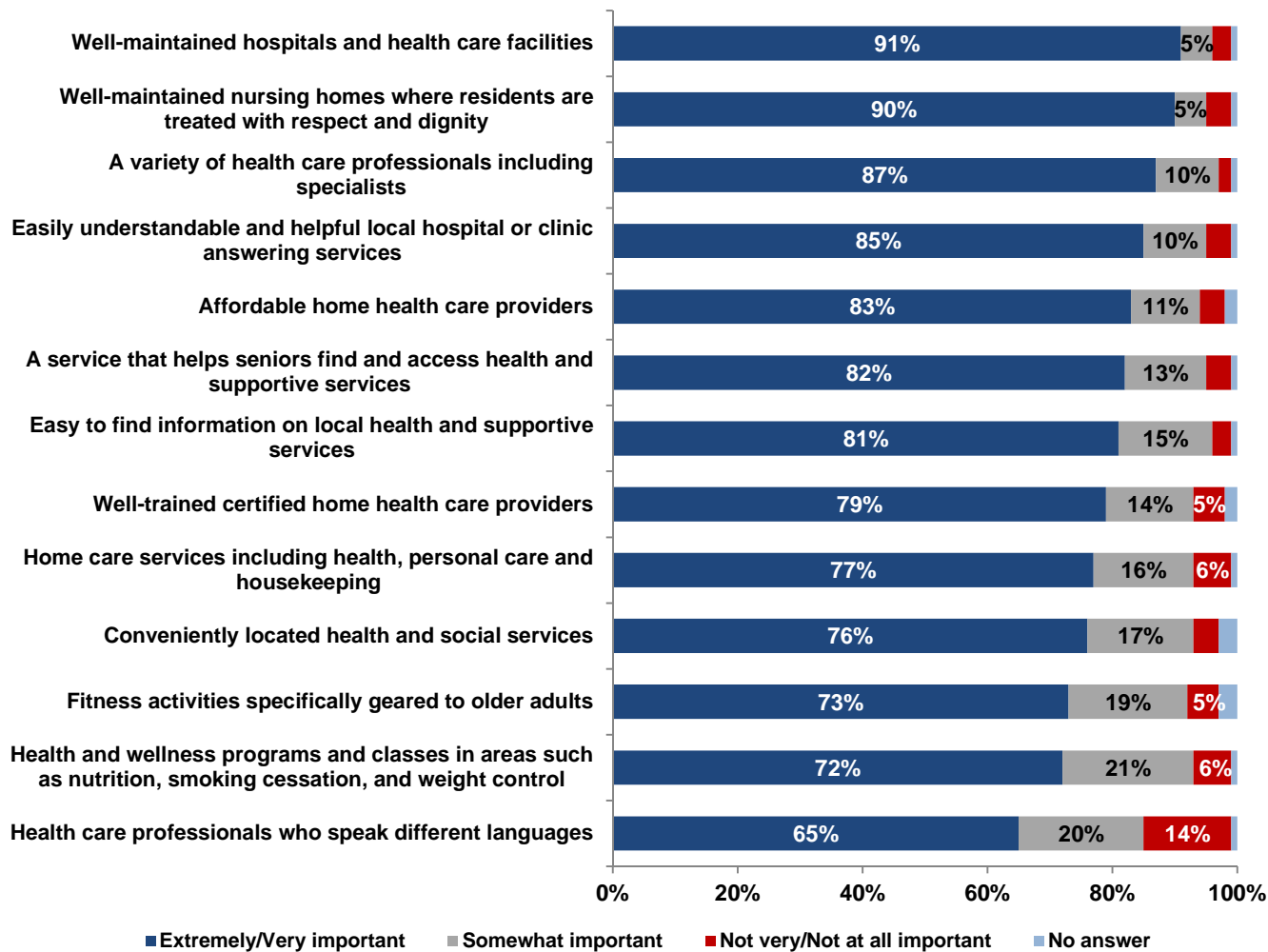

**AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver believe well-maintained hospitals and nursing homes, a variety of health care professionals, and easily understandable health care facility answering services are the most important health features to have in their neighborhood.**

About four in five AARP Hispanic members in Denver place high importance on having affordable and well-trained certified home health care providers, a service that helps seniors find and access health care services as well as easy to find information on these services. About three-quarters say having home care services such as personal care and housekeeping and conveniently located health and social services are important. Given the high level of physical activity of AARP Hispanic members in Denver it is not surprising that over seven in ten place high importance on having fitness activities for older adults and health and wellness programs in their neighborhood. About two-thirds of Hispanic members also believe it is important to have health care professionals who speak different languages available in their neighborhood.

**Health and Wellness Features of Importance to AARP Hispanic Members in Denver\* (n=277)**



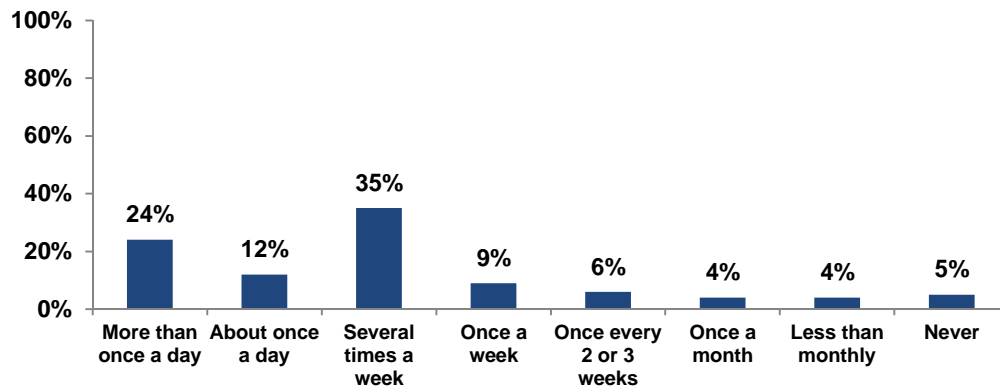

## Social Participation, Inclusion and Education Opportunities

**AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver interact regularly with others in their neighborhood, and some seek out continuing education opportunities.**

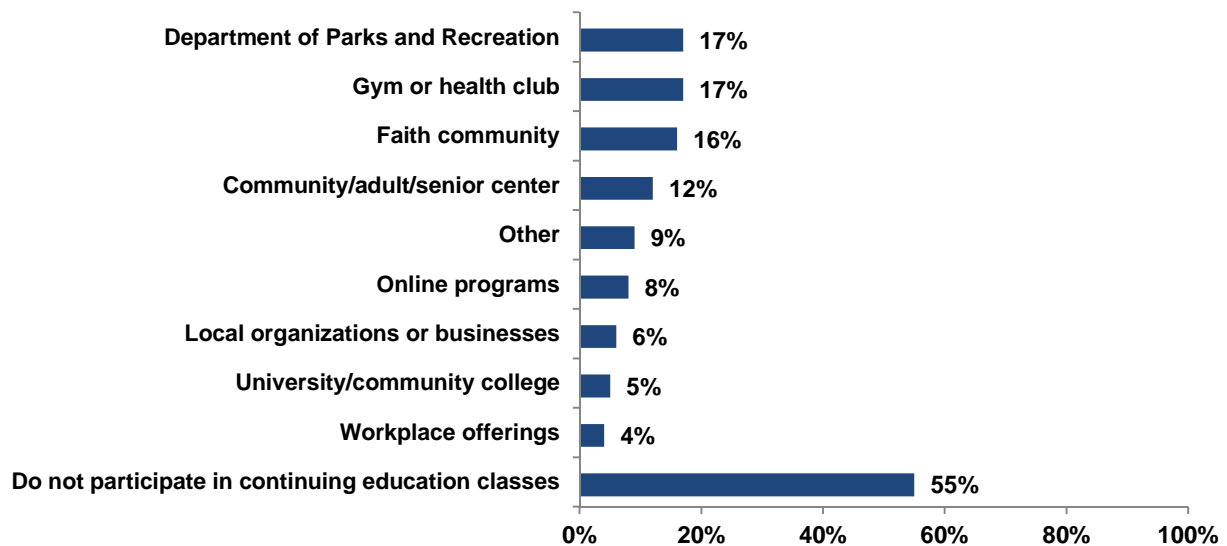
Over seven in ten (71%) say they interact with friends and neighbors in their neighborhood several times a week or more. About one in ten interacts with others in their neighborhood once a week (9%) or once every few weeks (6%).

When seeking out continuing education opportunities in their neighborhood over half say they do not do this. About one in six goes to the Department of Parks and Recreation, a gym or health club, or faith-based organizations. About one in ten says they go to community centers, or look to online programs. Fewer seek out continuing education opportunities at local organizations, universities or colleges, or their workplace.

**Places or Sources AARP Hispanic Members in Denver Go to for Continuing Education or Self-Improvement Classes\* (n=277)**

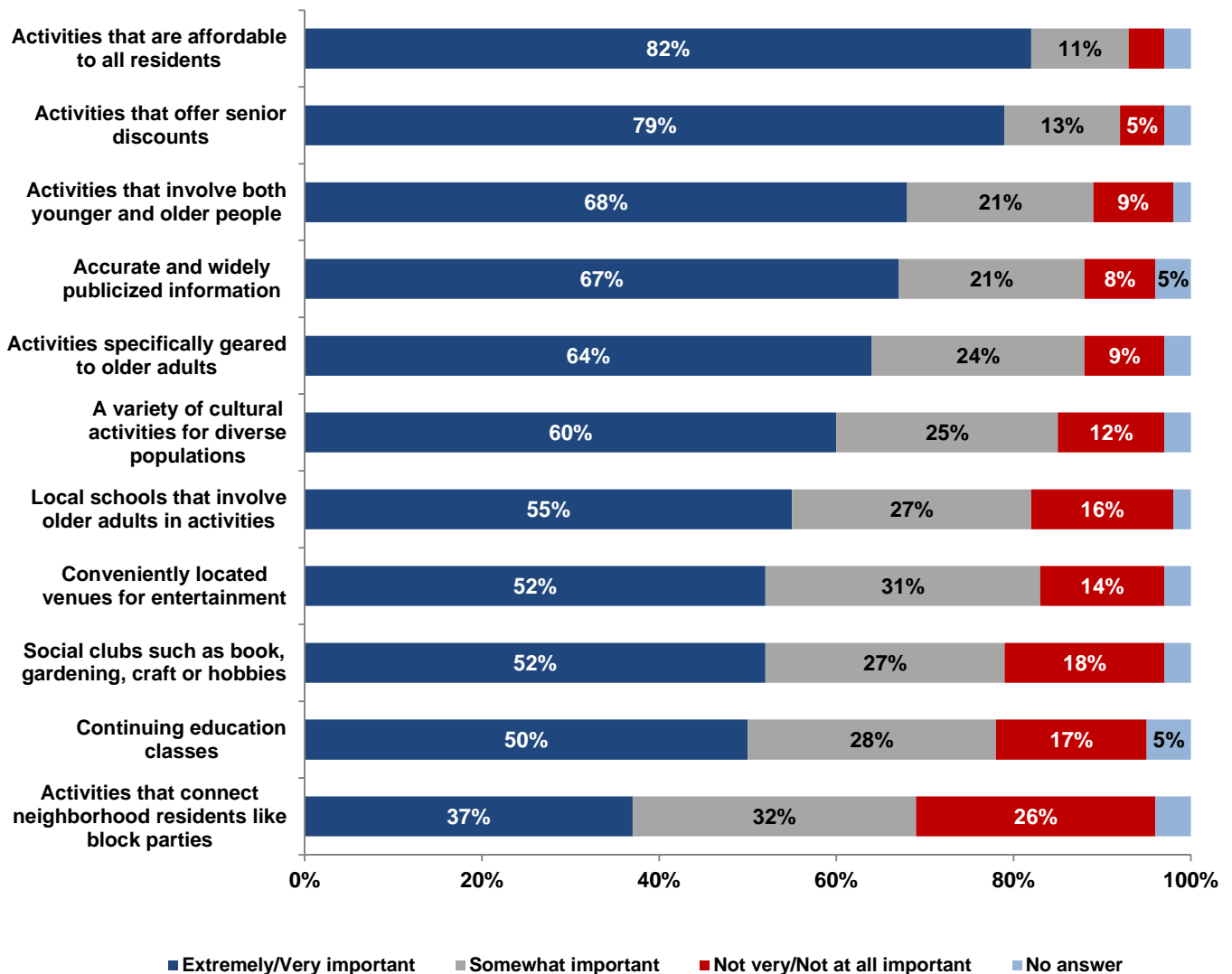

**AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver are active in their neighborhoods and believe the most important social features are to have neighborhood activities that are affordable for all residents and that offer senior discounts.**

When it comes to social participation, 50-plus AARP Hispanic members in Denver want to have activities that are affordable, geared to diverse audiences, and are easy to get to and find out about. About two-thirds say having activities that involve younger and older people, are accurately publicized, and geared toward older adults are extremely or very important. Three in five say it is important that there are activities that appeal to diverse audiences. About half want to live in neighborhoods that have local schools that involve older adults in activities, conveniently located entertainment venues, social clubs, and continuing education classes. Over a third believes having activities that connect neighborhood residents is important.

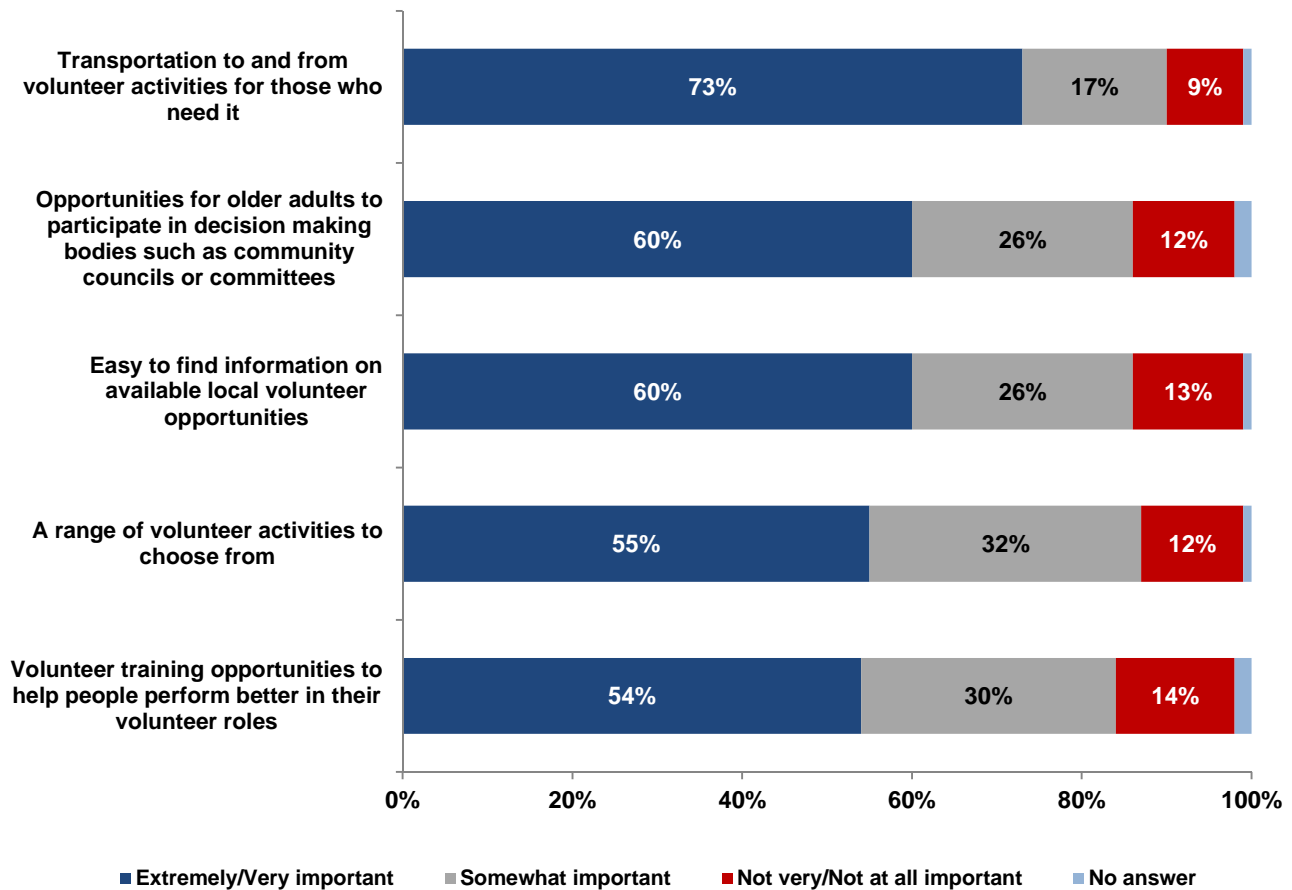
## Volunteering and Civic Engagement

**AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver believe it is important to have transportation available so residents can easily get to volunteer activities.**

When asked if they feel that older adults are consulted as resources when it comes to decision-making about neighborhood activities, less than a quarter (18%) believes older adults are consulted for this purpose. Just over two in five (41%) believe that older adults are not looked upon as decision-making resources and the same proportion (41%) say they are not sure. This perception among members is important to consider because six in ten say that they believe it is extremely or very important to have opportunities in their neighborhood that allow older adults to participate in decision-making bodies like community councils or neighborhood committees.

Half or more believe it is important that their neighborhoods have easy to find information on volunteer opportunities, a range of volunteer activities to choose from, and volunteer training opportunities that allow residents to better perform in these roles.

(n=277)



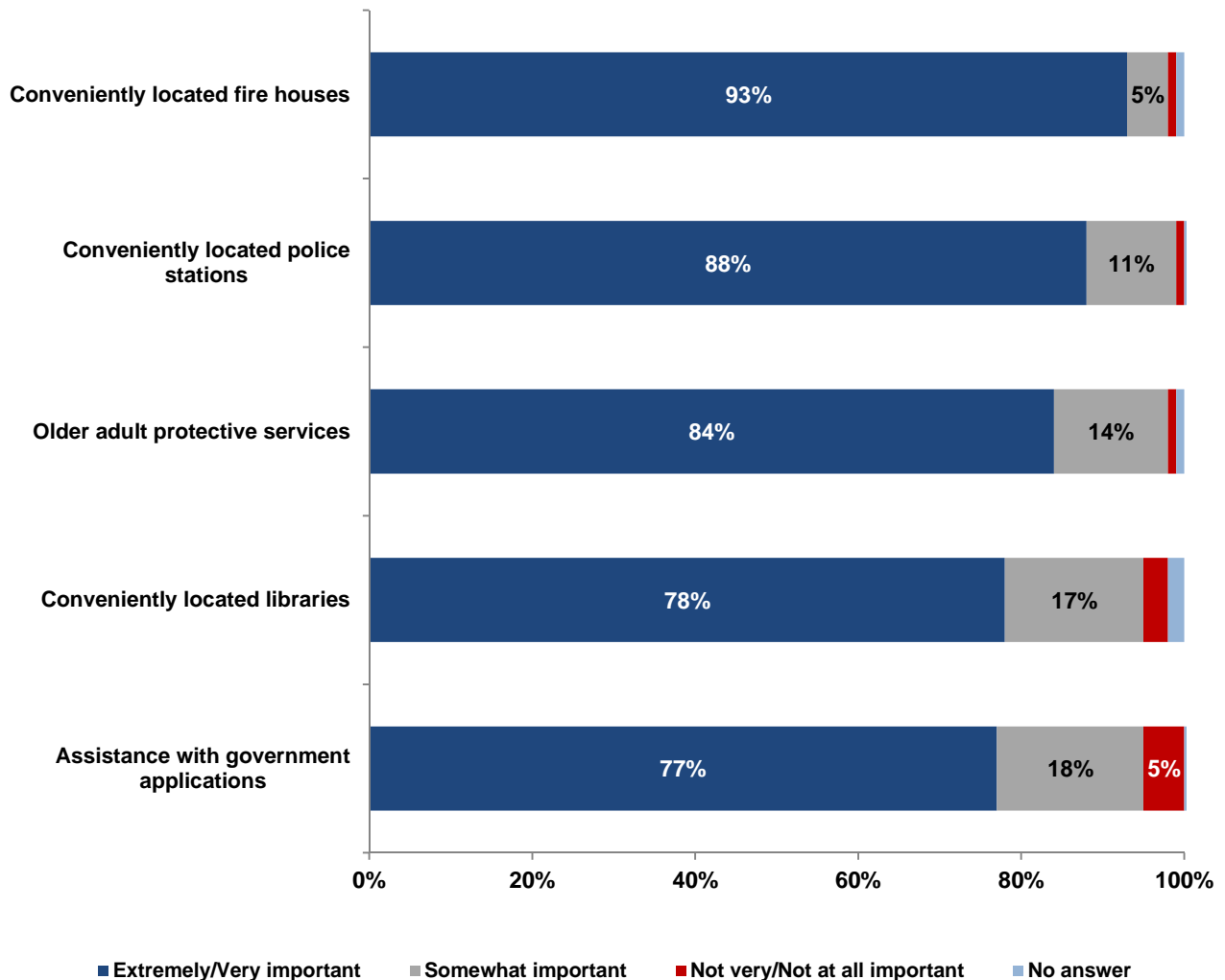

## Local Government Services

**Conveniently located fire houses tops the list of local government services that AARP 50-plus Hispanic members in Denver believe are important to have in their neighborhood.**

Other government services that are extremely or very important to four in five AARP Hispanic members in Denver are conveniently located police stations and libraries and older adult protective services. Over three-quarters say conveniently located libraries and assistance with government applications are important to have in their neighborhood.

(n=277)



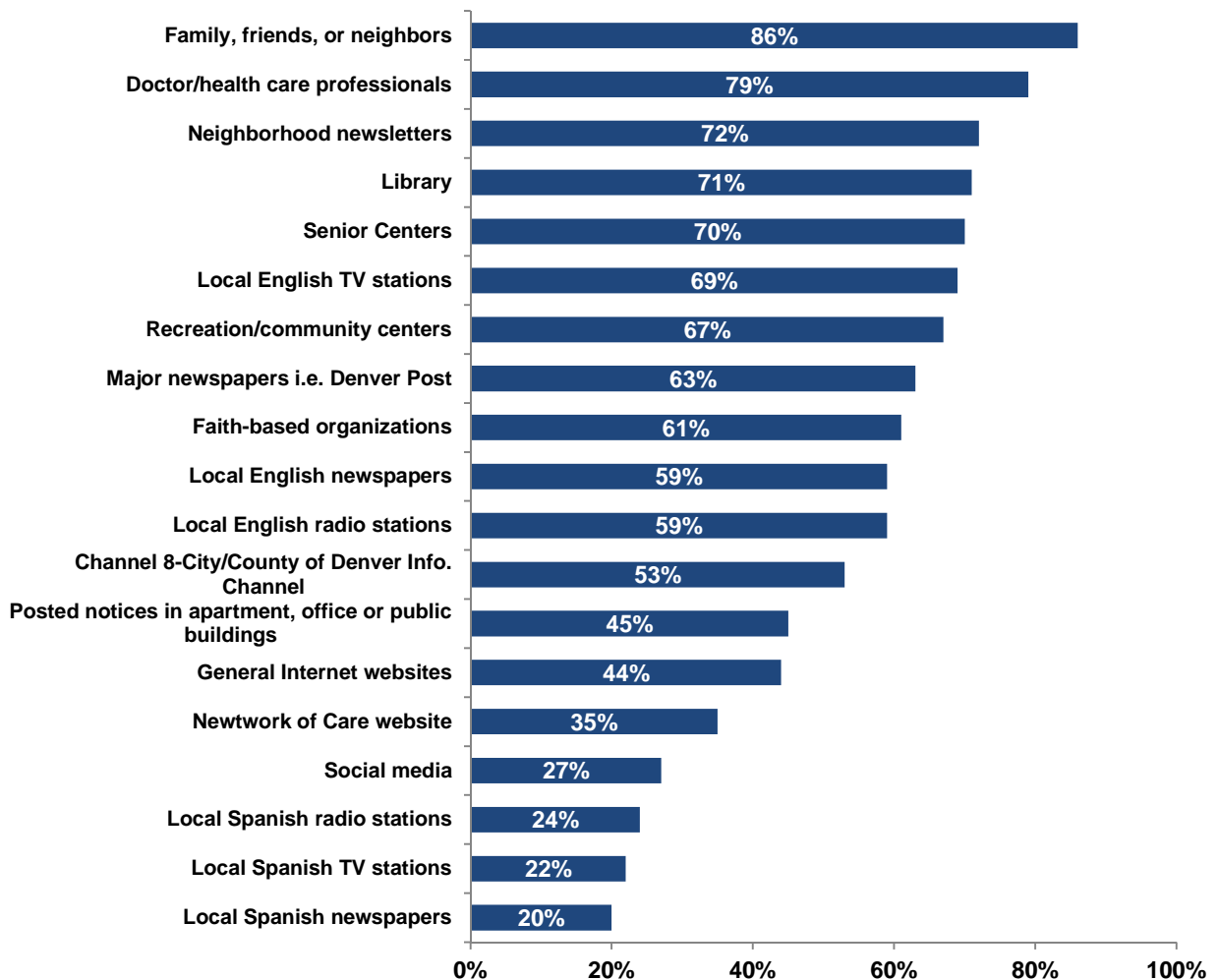

## Neighborhood Information

**Most AARP Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver say they would first turn family, friends, neighbors, or their doctor or other health care professional for information on services for older adults.**

A second tier of information sources that two-thirds of AARP Hispanic members in Denver would turn to are neighborhood newsletters, the library, senior centers, or local English television stations. Just over two-thirds would turn to recreation or community centers, while about three in five would look to major newspapers, faith-based organizations, local English newspapers, or local English radio stations. Over half would tune into Channel 8-City/County of Denver, while just over two in five would seek information from posted notices in buildings or the Internet. When asked specifically about using the “Network of Care” website at [www.drcog.networkofcare.org](http://www.drcog.networkofcare.org), over a third says they would turn to this source for information on older adult services. Interestingly, a quarter or less of Hispanic members would use social media or local Spanish newspapers, radio, or television stations to find out information on older adult services.

(n=277)

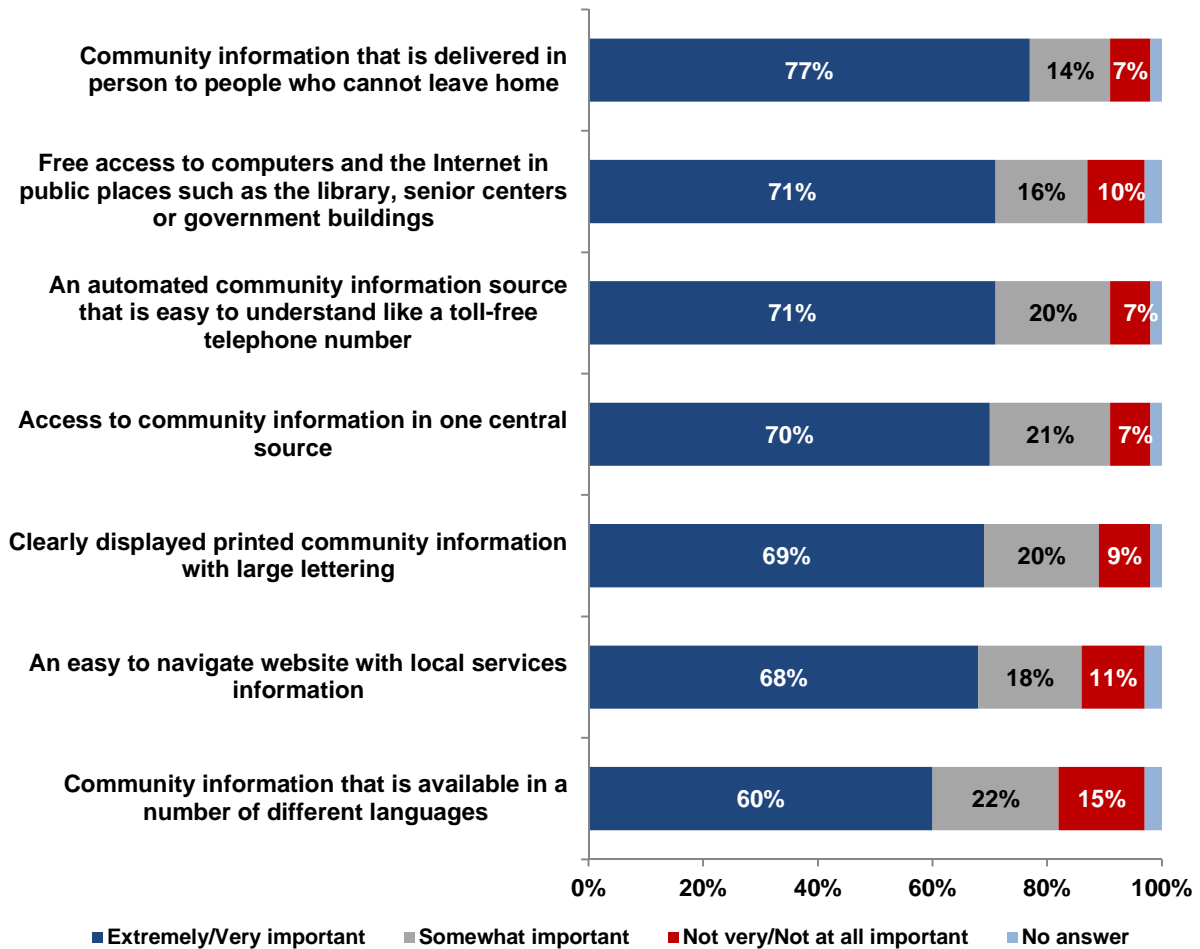

**Community information that is delivered in person to residents who may not be able to leave their home tops the list of information features that AARP 50-plus Hispanic members in Denver believe is important to have in their neighborhood.**

AARP 50-plus Hispanic members in Denver also want to have access to local neighborhood information in a myriad of other ways. About seven in ten believe free access to computers and the Internet as well as an easy to navigate website is important to have in their neighborhood. About the same proportion also say it is important to have an automated source like a toll-free number, information that is in one central source, and information that is clearly printed and easy to read. Although having information available in different languages ranks at the bottom of the list, it is still viewed as important by three in five AARP Hispanic members in Denver.

## Gaps in Neighborhood Features and Services

In order to identify the needs of 50-plus AARP Hispanic members in Denver, survey respondents were asked how important the prior neighborhood features and services were to them. Then they were asked if these features and services existed in their neighborhood. These questions were then paired together to identify neighborhood needs or “gaps.” Pairing these questions allows us to look at “gaps” between the importance of a feature or service and its presence in the neighborhood. To compare these questions, respondents who said a feature or service is extremely, very or somewhat important were aggregated and then compared to respondents who said the feature or service was present in their neighborhood. Survey respondents who said they were not sure if a feature or service was in their neighborhood were removed from this analysis.

**The top neighborhood needs as defined by importance vs. presence gaps are concentrated in five key areas: volunteer opportunities, neighborhood information, local government services, housing, and health and wellness.**

If we examine individual items across all eight domains, the top needs, or gaps between importance and presence are in: the volunteer opportunities, neighborhood information, local government services, housing, and health and wellness domains with neighborhood information taking four slots in the top gaps and volunteer opportunities taking three slots among the top items. These are followed by housing taking two slots and local government services and health and wellness taking one slot each among the top items.

The largest gaps or needs for 50-plus AARP Hispanic members in Denver are having transportation to and from volunteer opportunities and an automated community information source that is easy to understand.

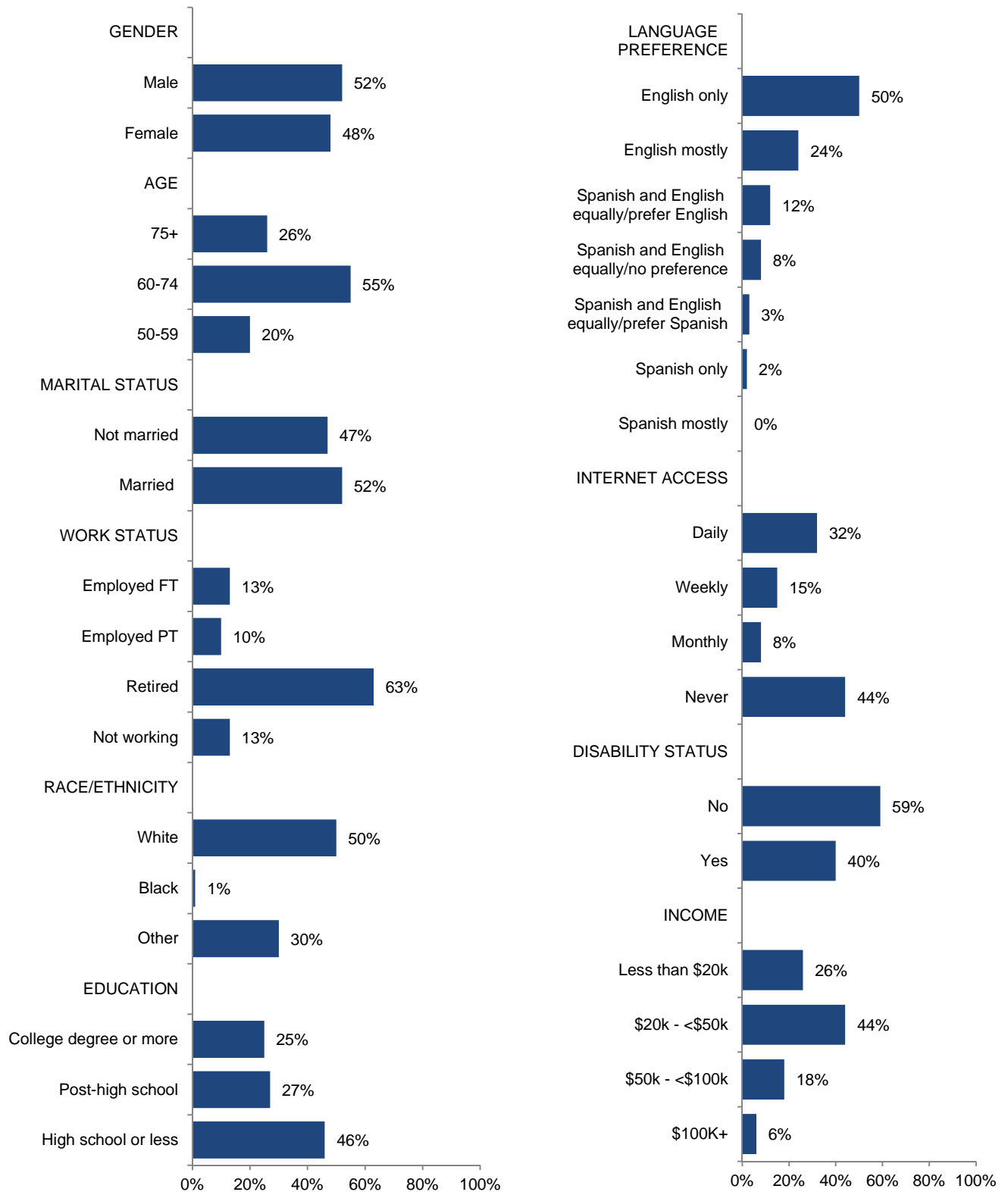

# Methodology

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The AARP Colorado Office commissioned a mail survey on livable communities of 2,000 AARP members age 50-plus and 1,000 AARP “Likely” Hispanic members age 50-plus in Denver, Colorado. The sample was drawn at random from AARP’s membership database.

The survey was fielded from October 31 through November 28, 2014 and exactly 1,004 useable surveys were returned by the cut-off date and 37 surveys were returned as undeliverable, for a response rate of 34 percent. Each sampled member was contacted about the survey four times receiving the following pieces of mail: pre-notification postcard, the survey itself, a reminder postcard, and a second copy of the survey. The survey has a margin of error of  $\pm 3.2$  percent. This means that if 95 out of 100 samples of this same size and population were given the same survey, the responses to the questions would fall within a range of plus or minus 3.2 percentage points of what would have been obtained if every AARP member age 50 years and older in the sampled area were asked the same questions. The sample was weighted by age and gender to reflect the actual distribution of AARP members age 50-plus in Denver, Colorado and the weighted number of responses is also 1,004. This report is based only on the responses for 277 Hispanic AARP members age 50-plus living in Denver, Colorado. The response rate for this sample of 277 members is nine percent and the margin of error is  $\pm 6.0$  percent.

Percents may not add to 100 percent due to rounding, multiple answers permitted for some items and non-response. Percentages in the text may also differ slightly from the graphs due to rounding.
