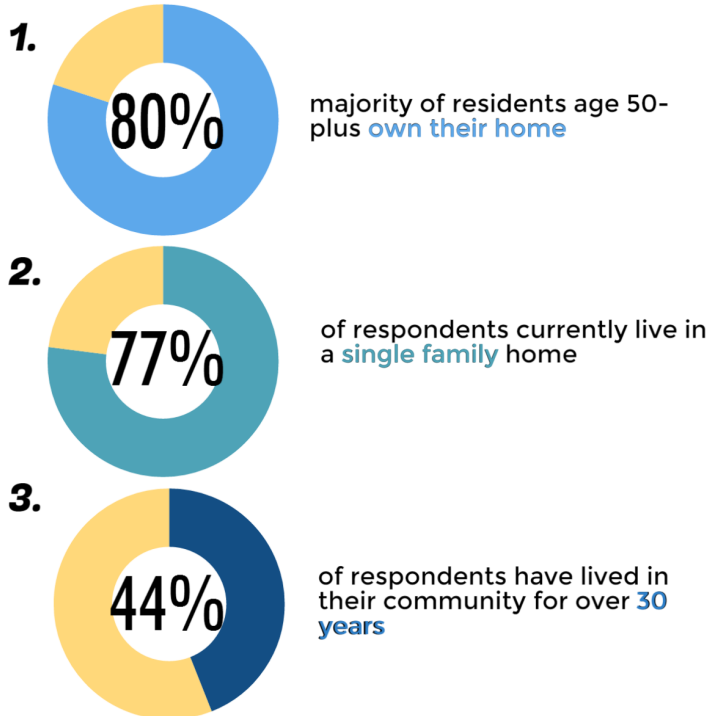

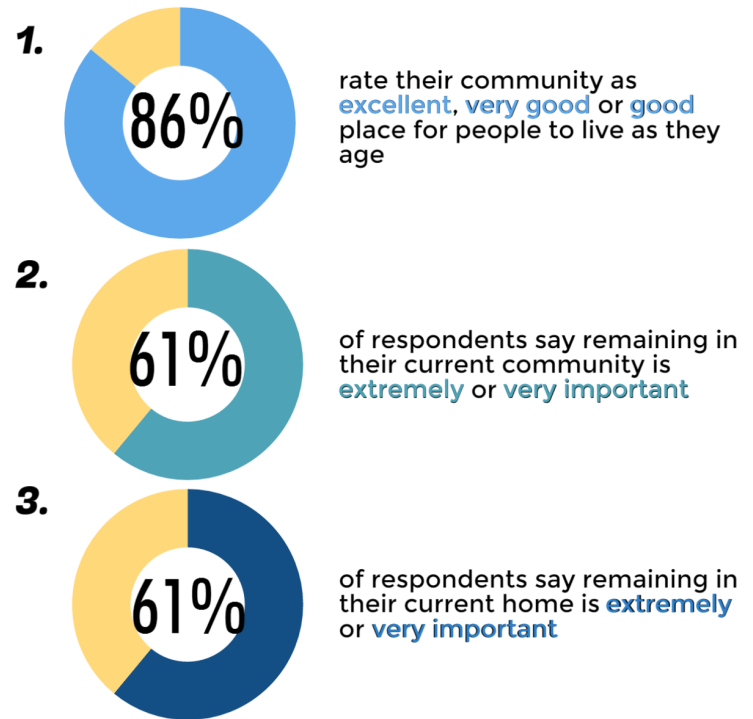

34 years



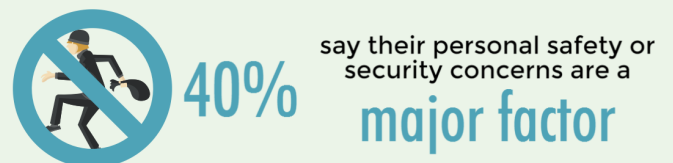
- Community residents age 50-plus have lived in their home an average of...

Did You Know?

Top two factors that influence residents to move as they age...



➤ Majority of residents age 50-plus expect to stay in their home or community as they age.

57% of residents are more likely to...
stay in their current residence and never move

25% of residents are more likely to...
move to a different community

14% of residents are more likely to...
move into a different residence in their community

Well-maintained homes and properties	47%	Well-maintained, safe low-income housing	30%
