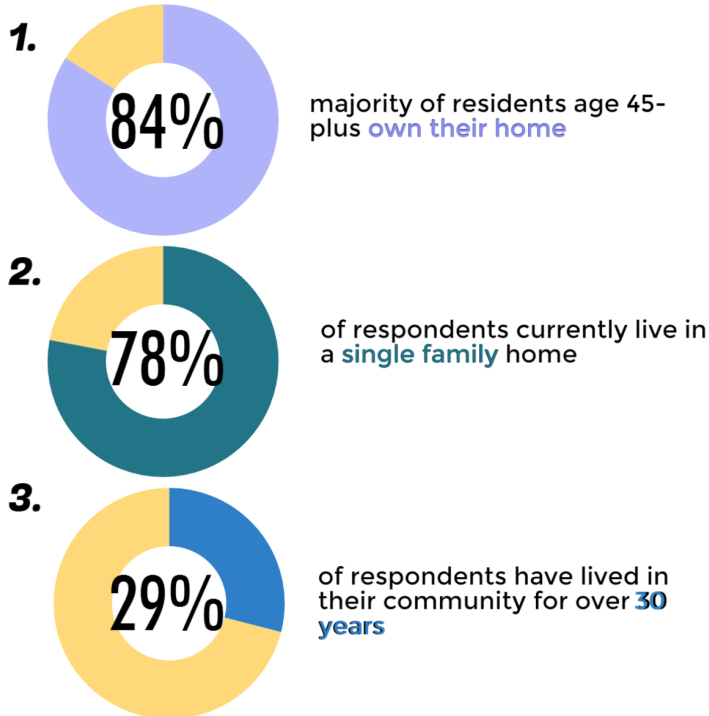

19 years



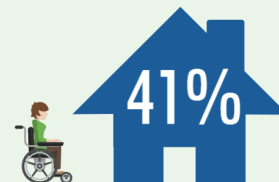
Did You Know?

Top two factors that influence residents to move as they age...



say personal safety or security concerns are a

major factor



say wanting a home that will help them live independently as they age is a

major factor

➤ Majority of residents age 45-plus expect to stay in their home or community as they age.

61% of residents are more likely to...
stay in their current residence and never move

17% of residents are more likely to...
move to a different community

12% of residents are more likely to...
move into a different residence in their community

Well-maintained homes and properties	51%	Well-maintained, safe low-income housing	31%
Seasonal services for low-income and older adults	41%	Affordable housing options for adults of varying income levels	28%
