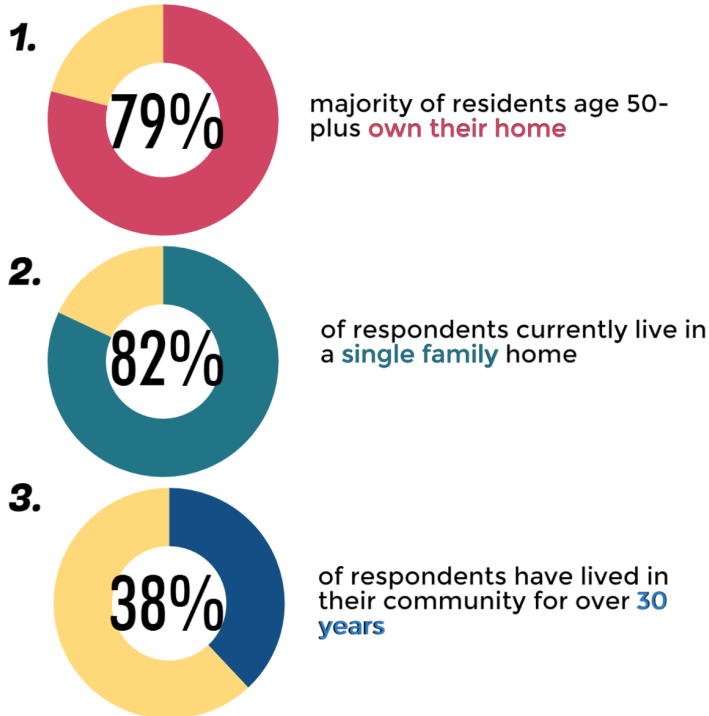

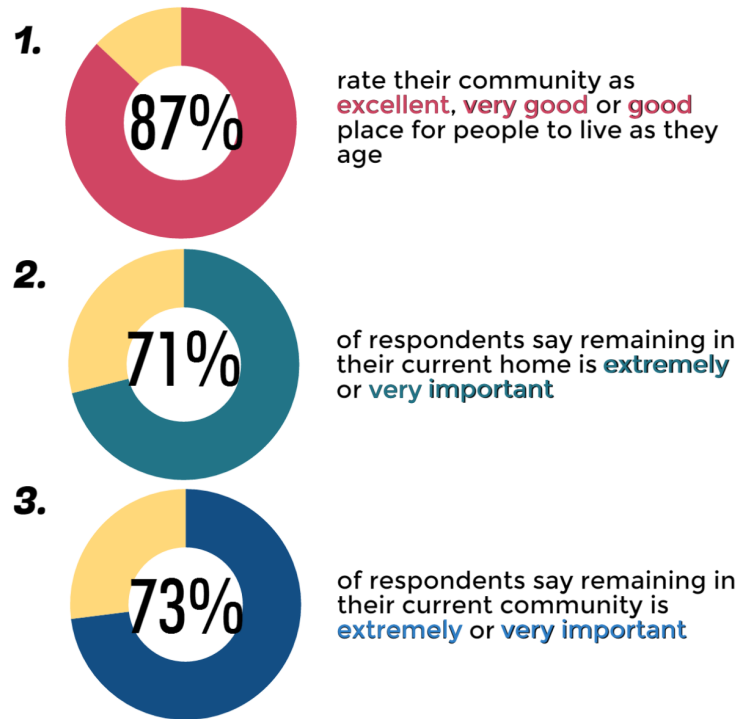

29 years

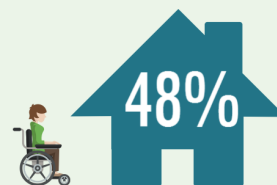
- Community residents age 50-plus have lived in their home an average of...

Top two factors that influence residents to move as they age...

➤ Majority of residents age 50-plus expect to stay in their home or community as they age.

64% of residents are more likely to...
stay in their current residence and never move

19% of residents are more likely to...
move to a different community

13% of residents are more likely to...
move into a different residence in their community

Well-maintained homes and properties	50%	Seasonal services for low-income and older adults	26%
Home modification and repair contractors	41%	Affordable housing options for adults of varying income levels	25%
