

Welcome to the Age-Friendly Community Survey Tableau database. This database is an interactive visual platform that allows users to view the Age-Friendly Community Survey data for the 14 communities, surveyed in 2015, in aggregate *or* by individual community.

The database is made up of 15 tabs, each of which contains various reports.

- Tab 1- Summarized statistics
- Tab 2- Community Domain
- Tab 3- Housing Domain
- Tab 4- Outdoor Spaces and Buildings Domain
- Tab 5- Transportation and Streets Domain
- Tab 6- Health and Wellness Domain
- Tab 7- Social Participation, Inclusion and Education Opportunities Domain
- Tab 8- Volunteering and Civic Engagement Domain
- Tab 9- Job Opportunities Domain
- Tab 10- Community Information Domain
- Tab 11- Personal Demographics
- Tab 12- Lifestyle
- Tab 13- Social Behaviors
- Tab 14- Physical Health
- Tab 15- Socioeconomic/Voting Status

The data on each tab can be viewed by community, community rating, AARP membership, and age. It is important to note that the data in the Tableau are not weighted therefore the percentages may differ from those in the community reports, annotated surveys, and addendum tables.

To navigate through each of the tabs in the Tableau database follow the steps below:

1. Click on the tab you want to view.
2. Hover the mouse over the bars or pie slices in the graphs to see a detailed description of the survey item.
3. On the far right side of the screen you will see drop down or check boxes for community, community rating, AARP membership, and age. These filters allow you to view the data by different subgroups. The default option is "all" for each of these filters. If you keep the default option this shows the data for all 14 communities in aggregate.
4. To change the default option, click on the arrow/drop down box or check in the box to make your selection. It is important to note that the data for each community may be very similar and therefore appear to vary only slightly across communities but know that the data is changing with each new filter selection.

- When using the **community name** filter, click on the arrow/drop down box and select the community you want to look at.
 - When using the **community rating** filter, check on the box to view the community rating you want to look at. Clicking on “good” to shows the data for the survey respondents who rated their community as “excellent,” “very good,” or “good;” “poor” shows the data for the respondents who rated their community “fair” or “poor;” and “no response” shows the data for the respondents who did not answer the community rating question.
 - When using the **AARP membership** filter, clicking on “yes” shows the data for AARP members; “no” shows the data for non AARP members; and “all” shows the data for all respondents.
 - When using the **age filter**, check the box to view the age group you want to look at. Leaving the default option will show the data for all of the survey respondents. Clicking on multiple age group boxes shows the data for all of those age groups selected in aggregate. So for example, clicking on 45-54 and 55 to 64, shows the data for all of the respondents between the ages of 45 and 64.
5. Within each tab, at the very bottom right side of the screen there is an option for “Share” and “Download.” Clicking on the “Share” option, allows you to share a link to the Tableau database via email, Twitter or Facebook. Clicking on the “Download” option, allows you to download an image of the screen you are viewing in PDF or PNG format.

It is important to note that the gaps or needs shown on the summarized statistics and domains tabs (tabs 1 and 3 through 10) are calculated by taking the difference between the respondents who say a feature or service is “extremely,” “very,” or “somewhat important” and those who say a feature or service is present in their community.
