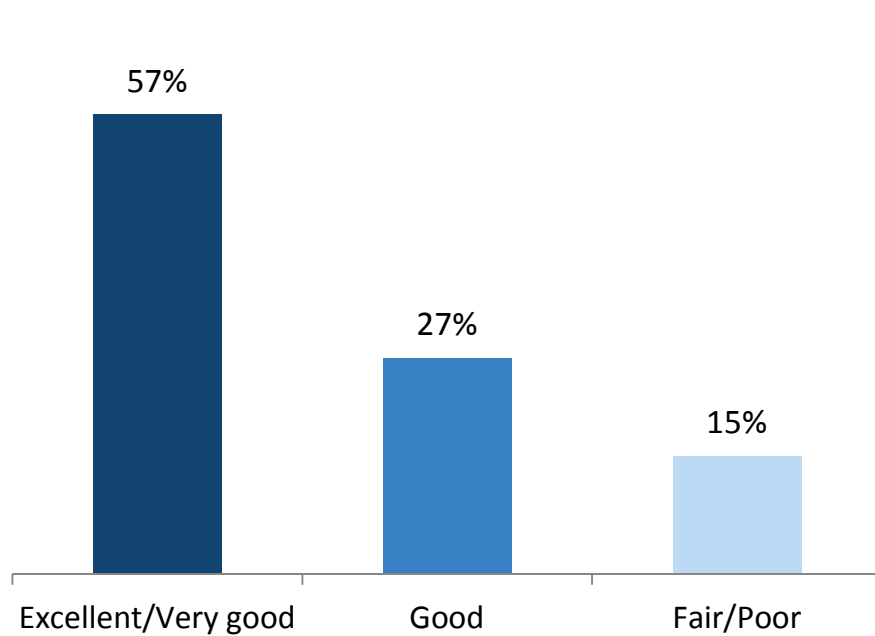

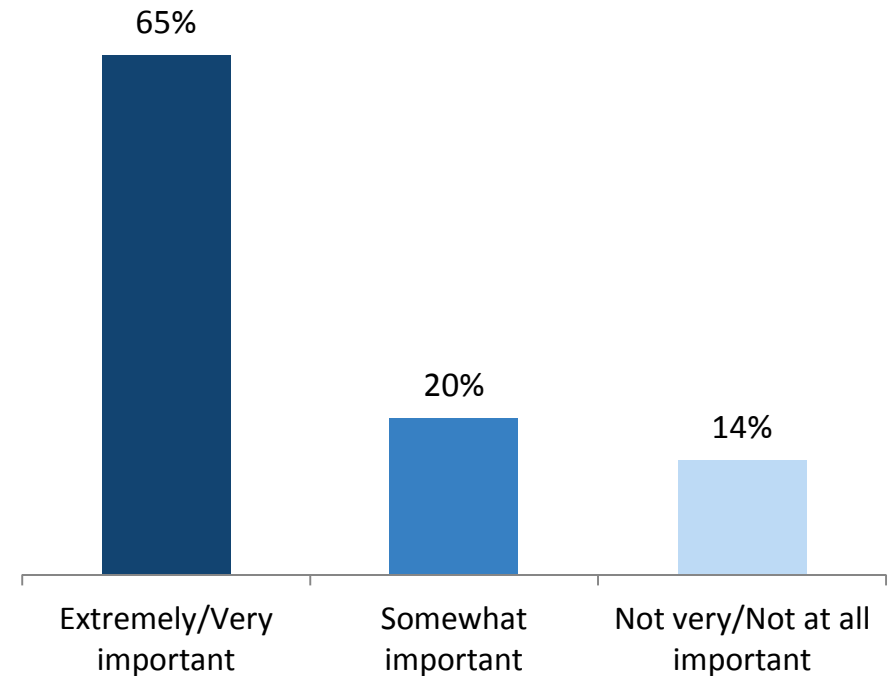

as a Place for People to Live as They Age



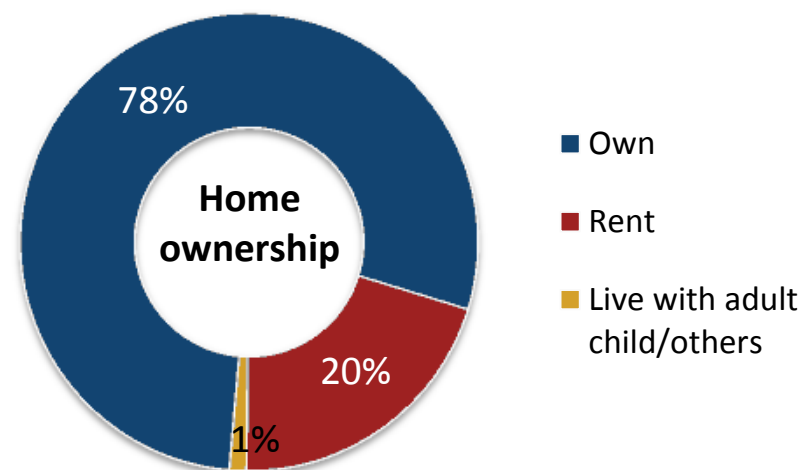
Importance of

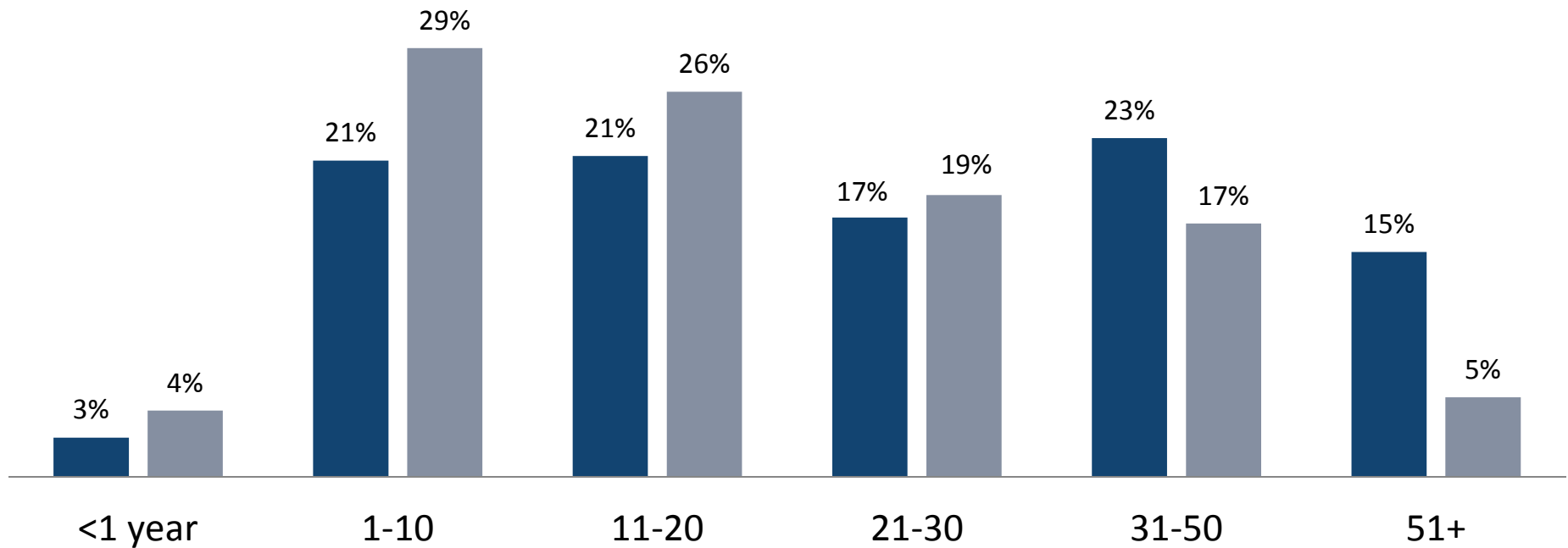

The majority of Tucson residents age 50+ expect to stay in their home or community as they get older.

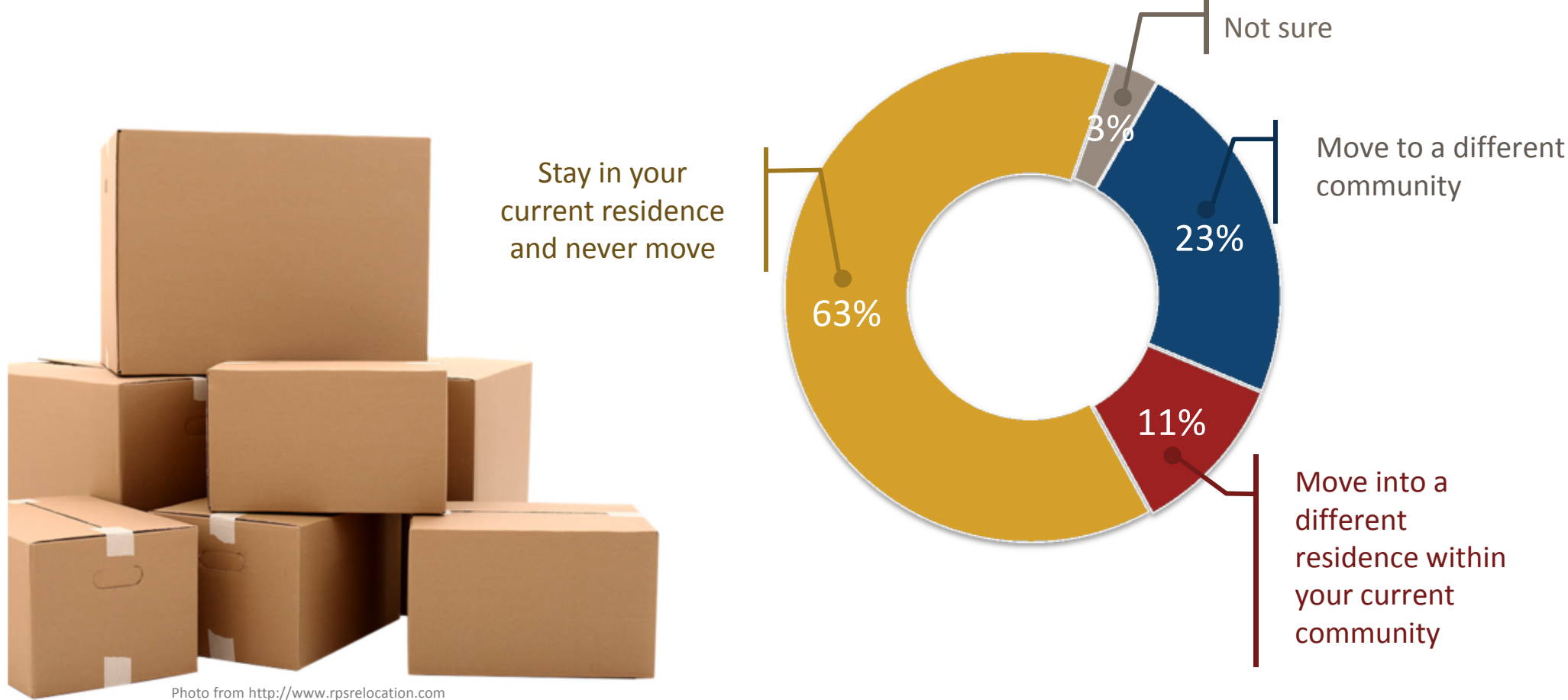
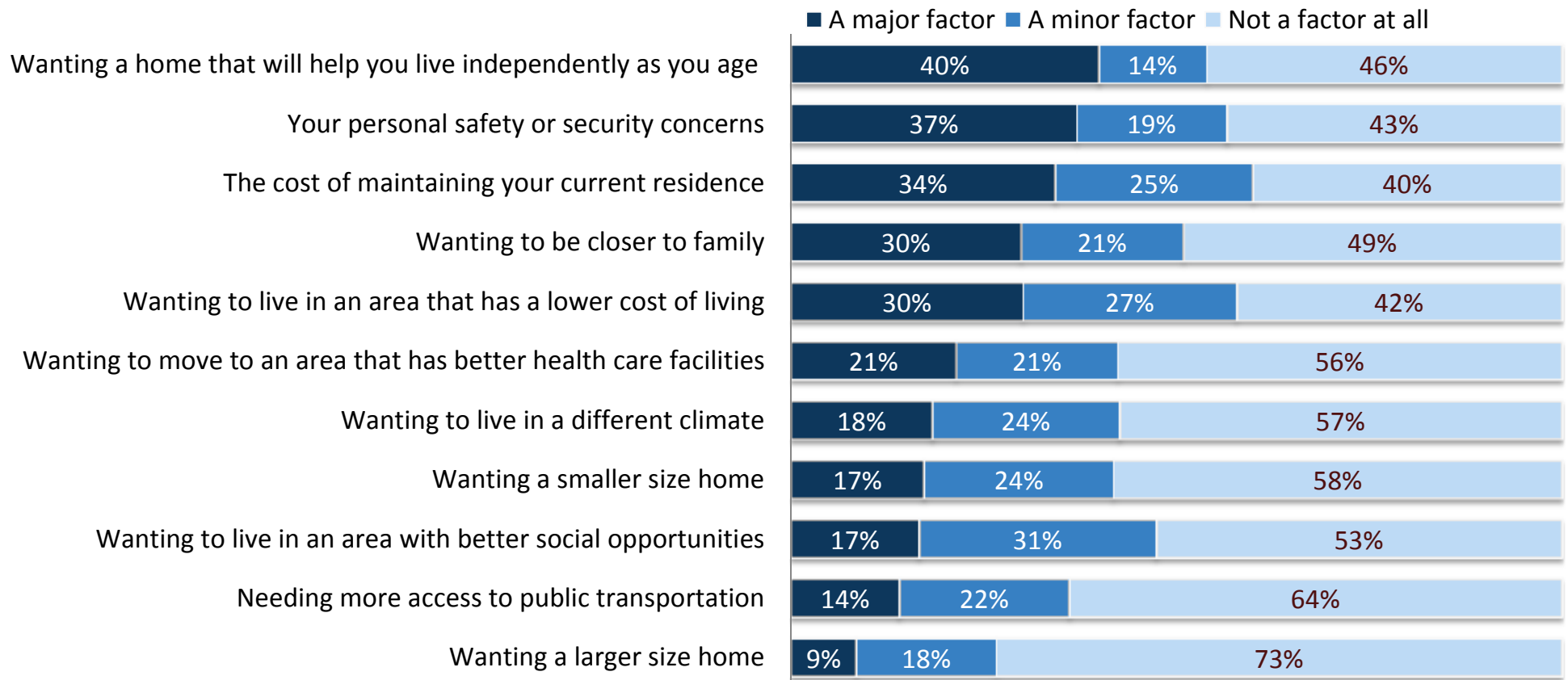

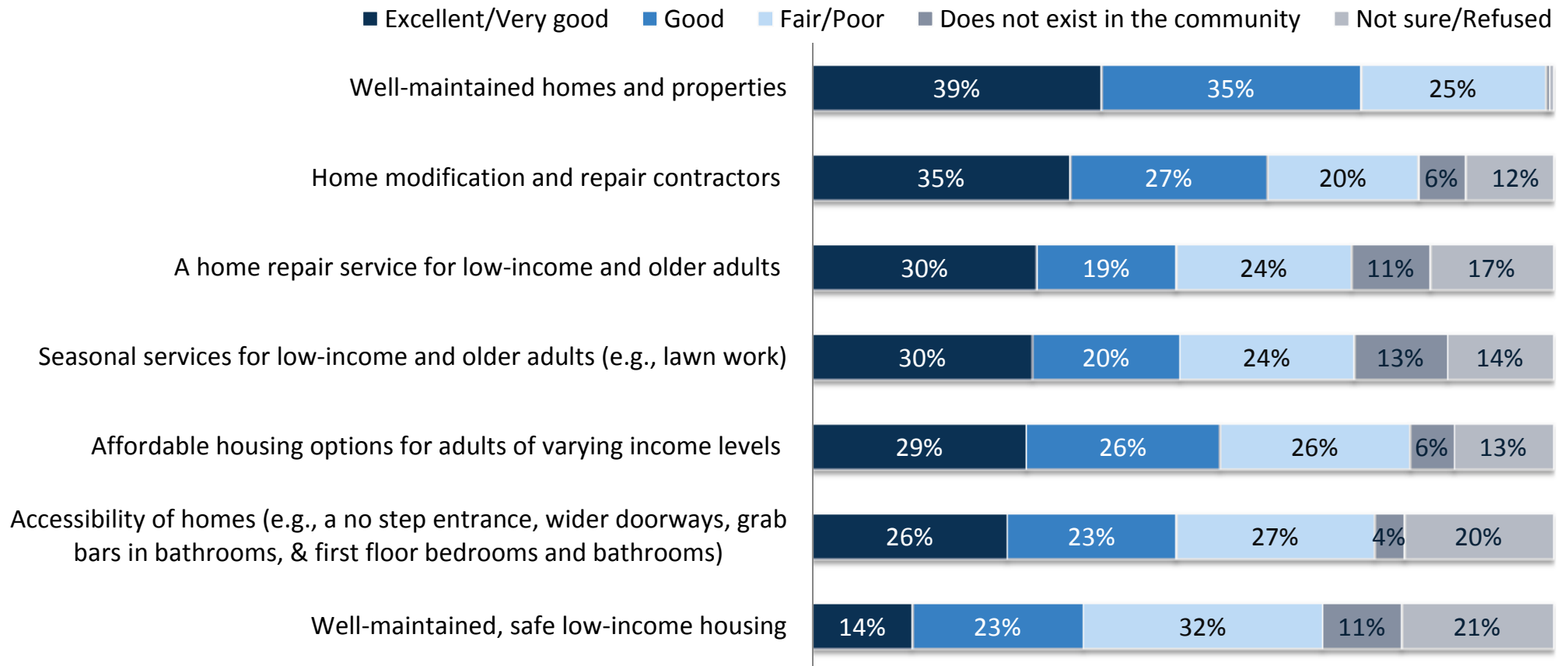
Age-friendly housing, safety, and affordability are influential factors for Tucson residents age 50+ considering moving when they get older.

Tucson residents age 50+ rate their community positively on having well-maintained homes and properties as well as good home modification and repair contractors.



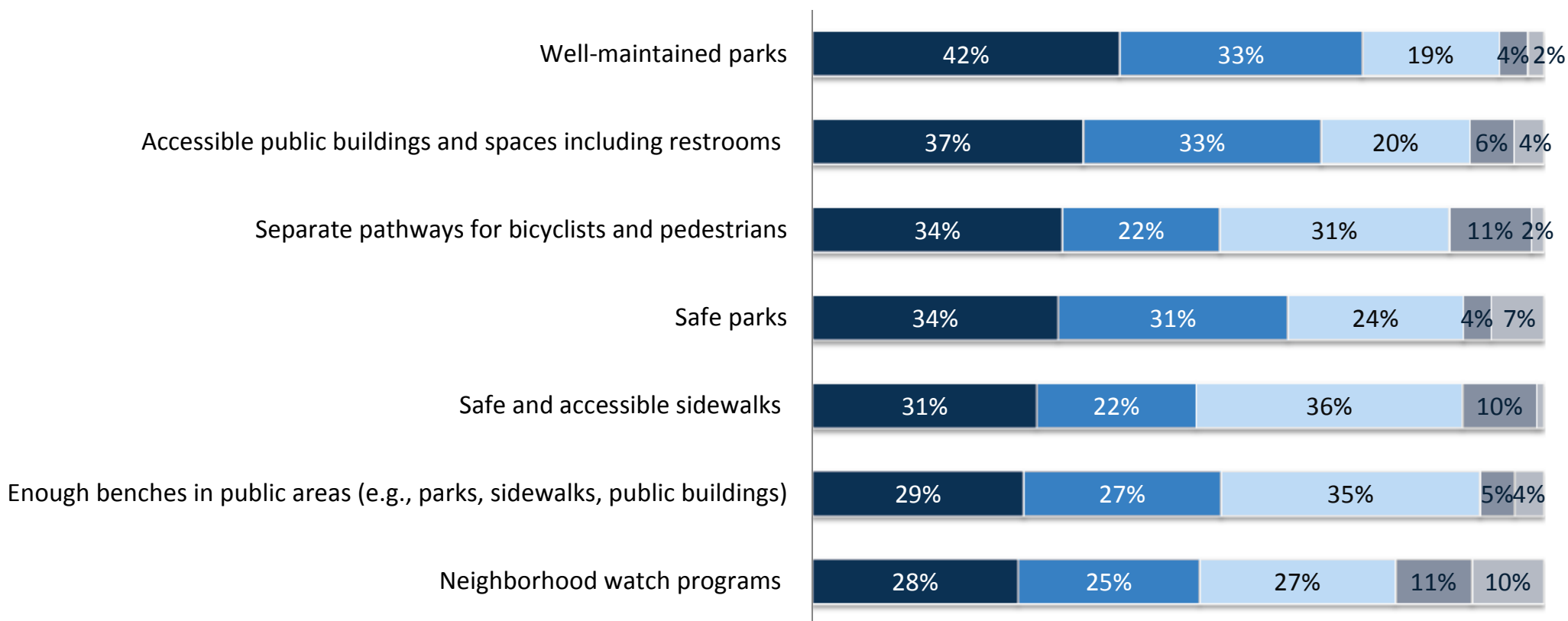

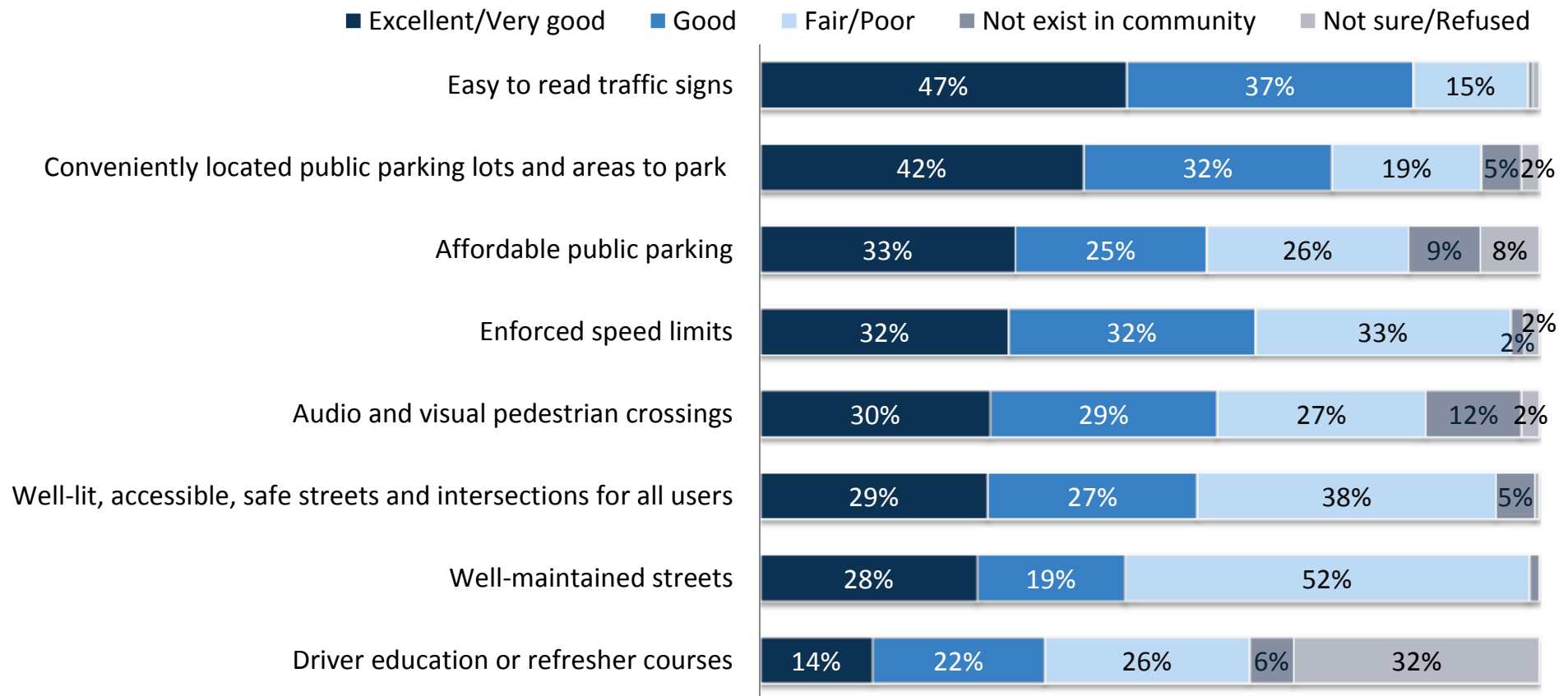

Tucson residents age 50+ rate their community excellent to good on having easy to read traffic signs and convenient public parking, although having well-maintained streets receives more negative ratings.

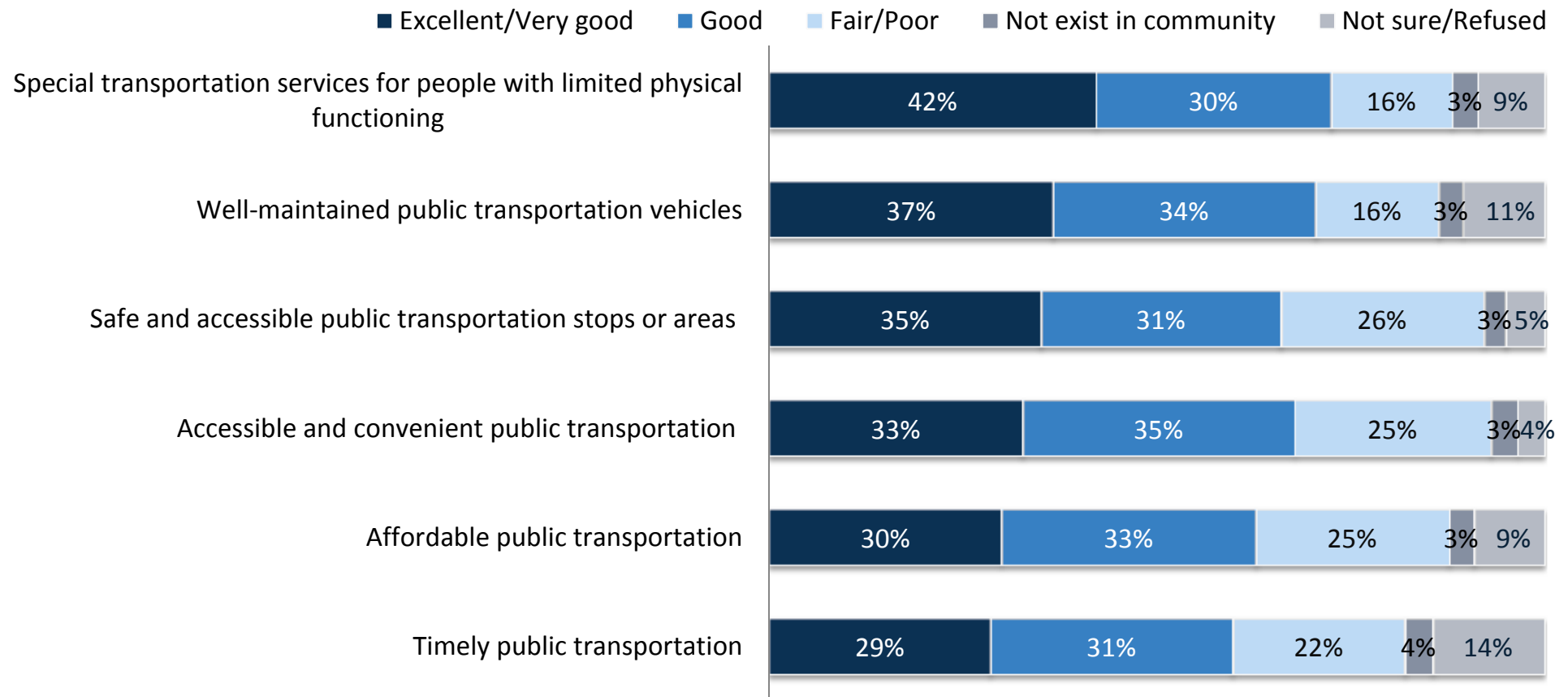

Tucson residents age 50+ feel their community offers excellent to good special transportation options and public transportation.



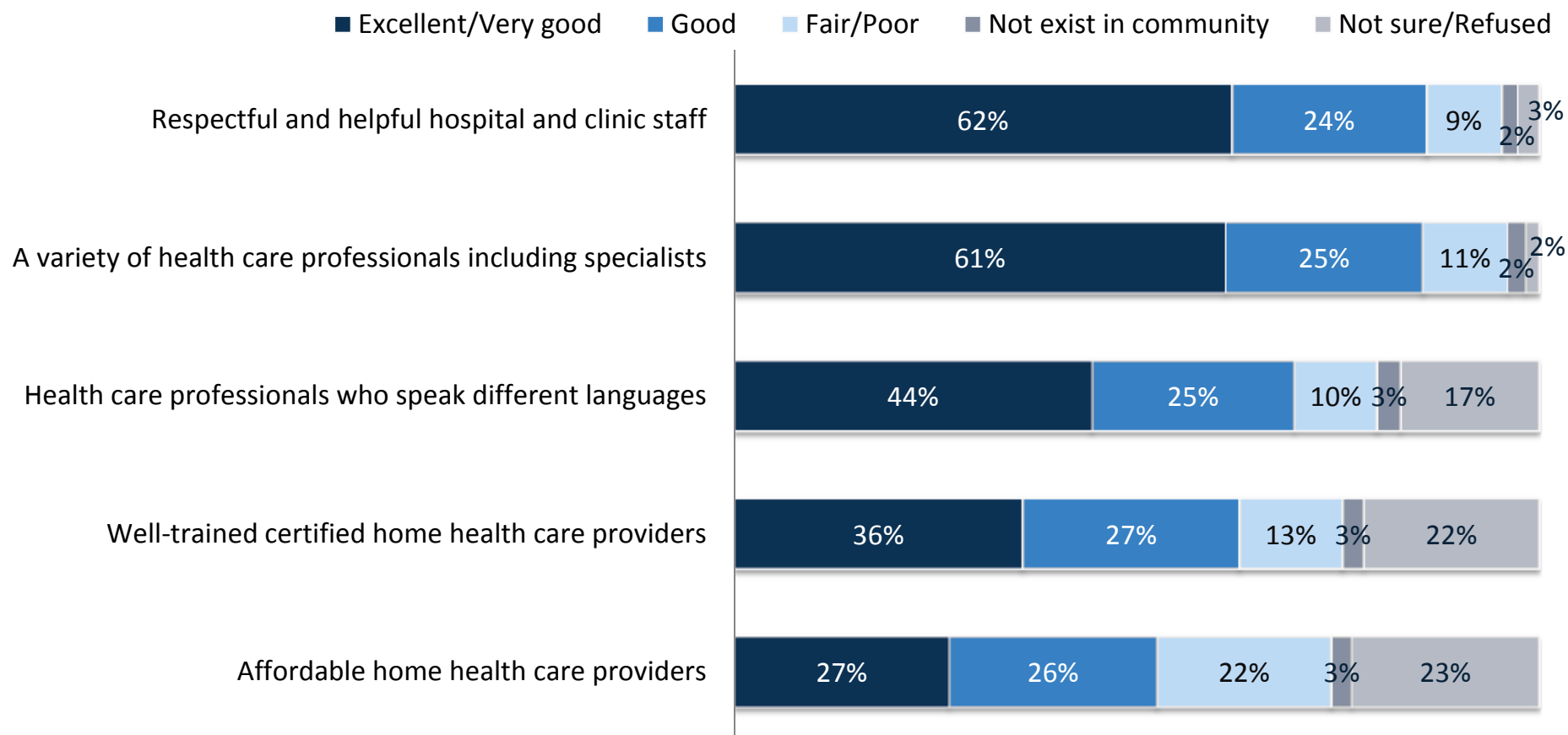

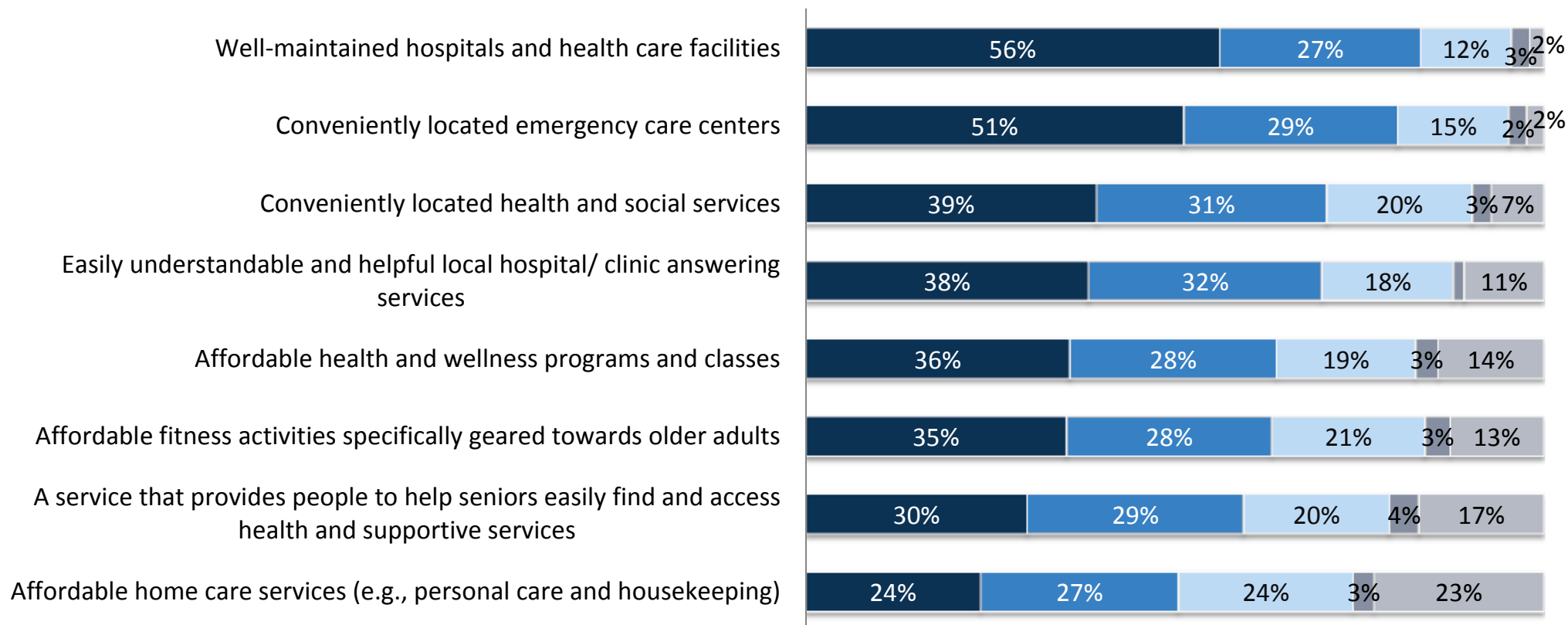

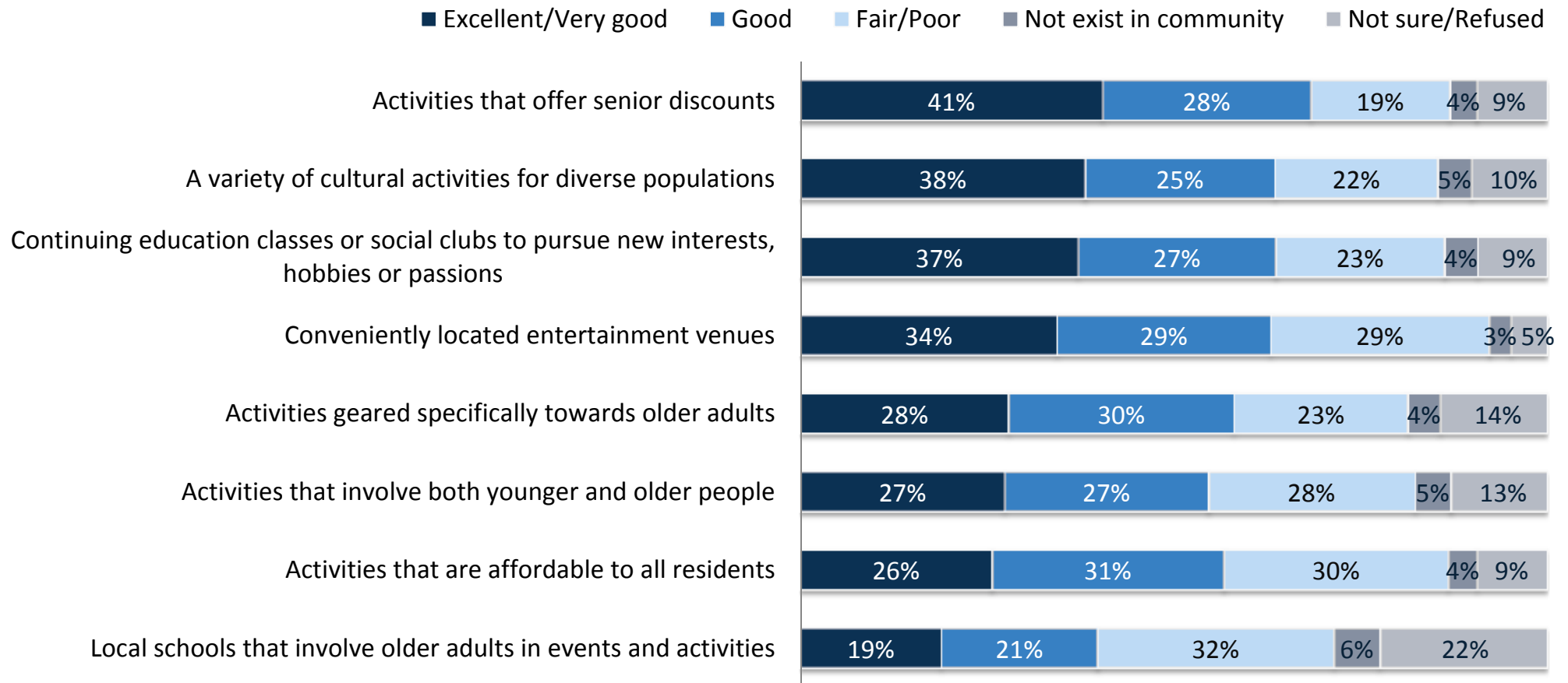

Tucson residents age 50+ say their community has a variety of affordable social activities at convenient locations.

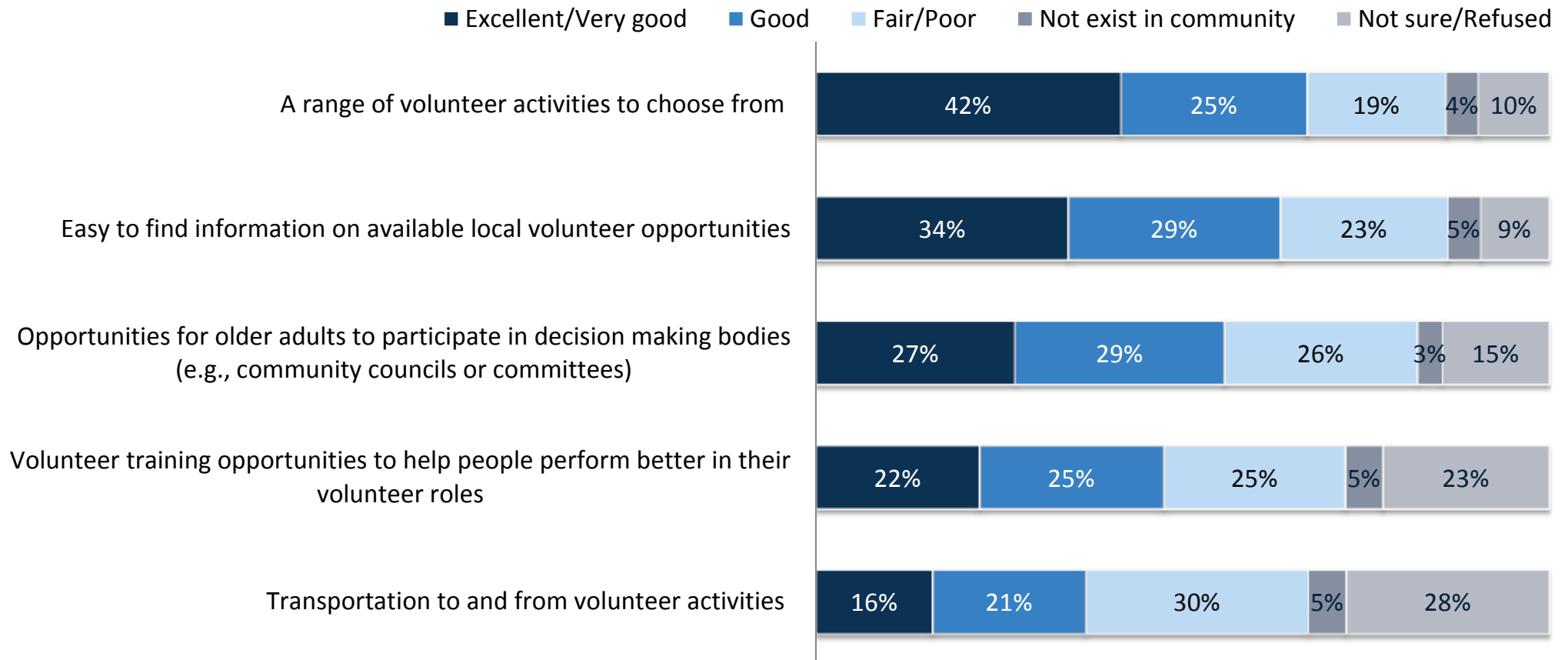

The majority of Tucson residents age 50+ rate their community positively on having access to a variety of volunteer activities that are easy to find.

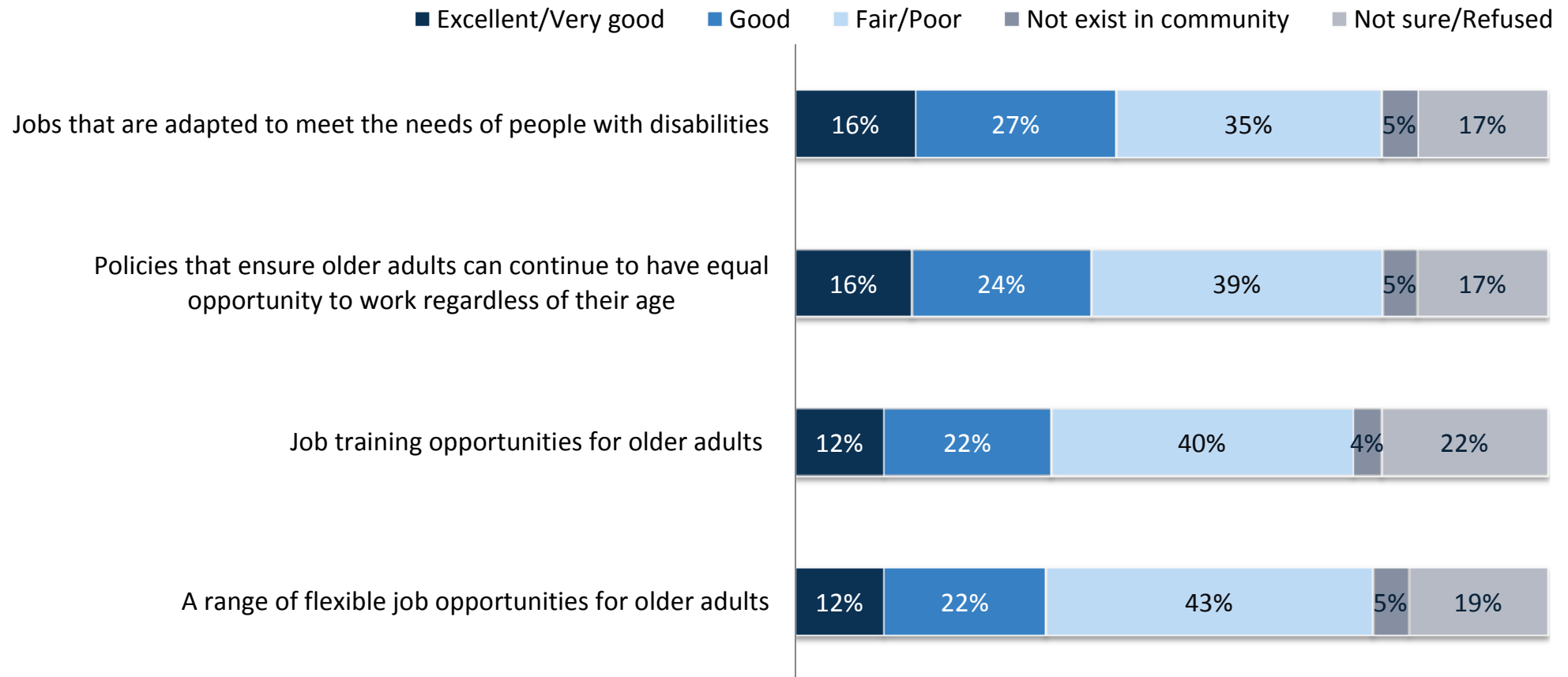

A plurality of Tucson residents age 50+ provide negative ratings for how well their community is doing in terms of having employment opportunities for older residents.



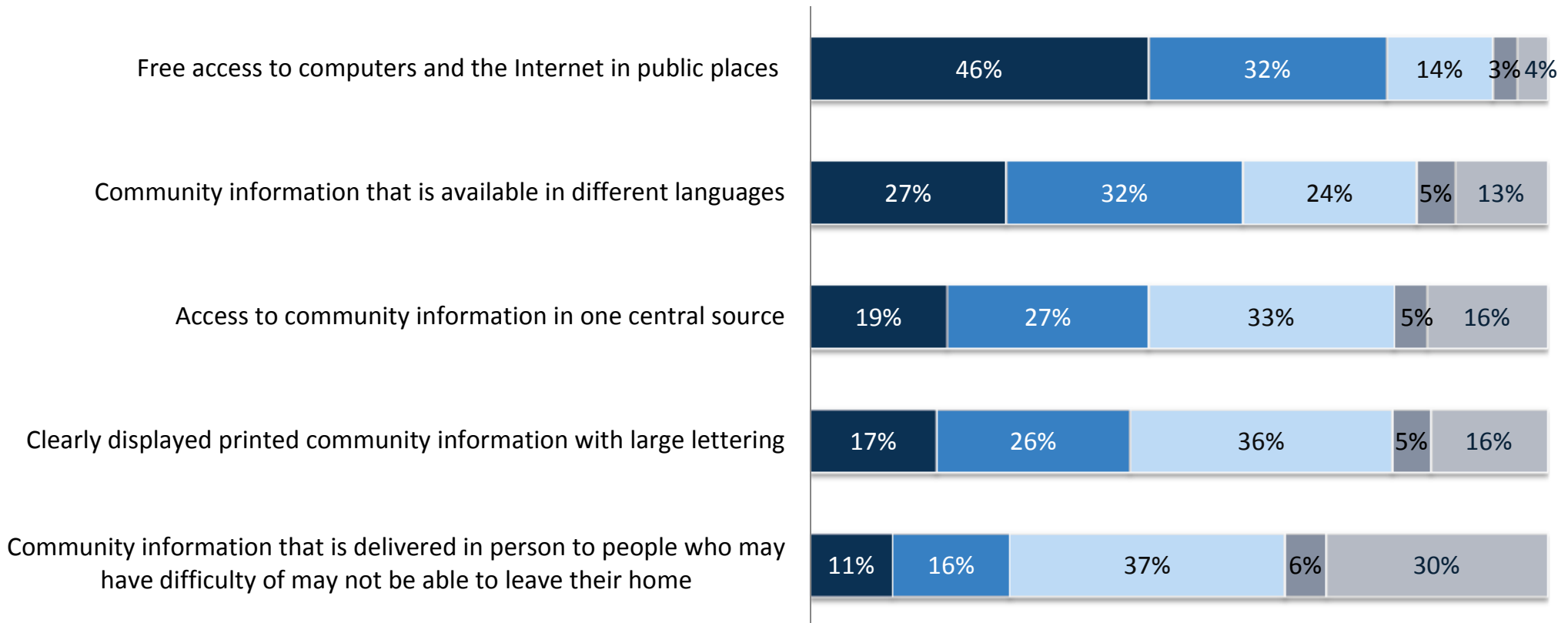

Survey Methodology:

- A telephone survey was commissioned by AARP to assess public opinion among Tucson residents age 50+ about age-friendly and livable community topics in Tucson.
- Telephone interviewing was conducted by Alan Newman Research from July 7th to July 21st 2017.
- A total of 518 interviews were conducted. The margin of error for this sample is $\pm 4.3\%$.
- The sample utilized RDD landline and cell phone records.
