



## Annotated Questionnaire

Telephone interviews conducted with 800 registered voters by landline (69%) and cell phone (31%) between 8/23/18 and 9/1/18. All data have been weighted by age, gender, race/ethnicity, and geographic distribution according to July 2018 Missouri State Voter Registration Database statistics. These survey results have a 3.5% margin of error.
