



## Annotated Questionnaire

Telephone interviews conducted with 610 registered voters by landline (69%) and cell phone (31%) between 9/6/18 and 9/16/18. All data have been weighted by age, gender, race/ethnicity, and geographic distribution according to August 2018 New York State Voter Registration Database statistics. These survey results have a 4.0% margin of error.
