Importance of long-term care to California residents:

79%

73%

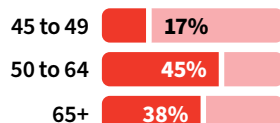

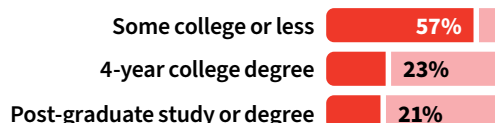

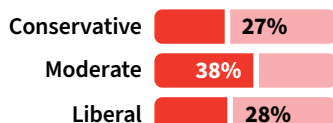

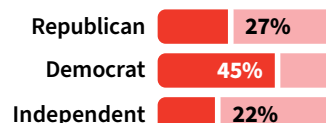
Caregiver Status



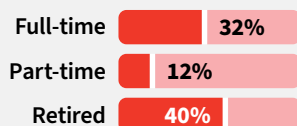

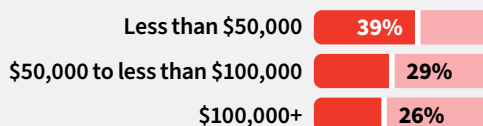

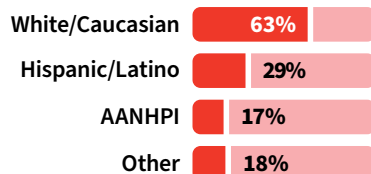
