87% say the services and supports provided by Medicaid are extremely or very important

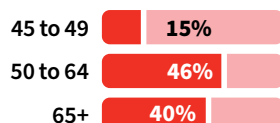

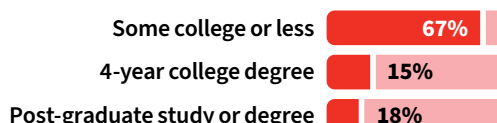

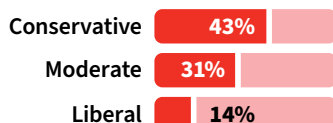

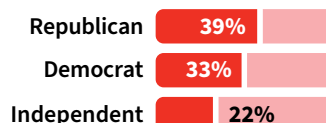
Caregiver Status



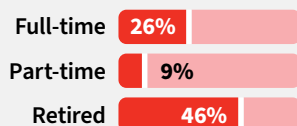

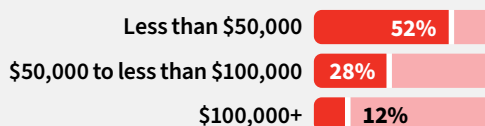

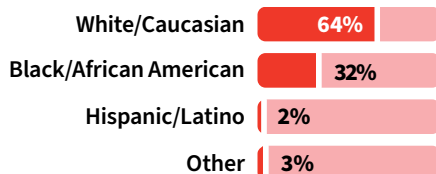
